PENDLETON, Ore., (Special)—The annual track and field meet of Umatilla county schools, held here Saturday, was won by Pendleton in both the high school and grade divisions.

Between periods when Pidecock, umpire, and Harris French were busily engaged with a rag wiping the old mud off the poles, Charley did his stuff to the tune of a round dozen strike-outs. And, to show the visitors that he wasn't a weak sister at the bat, Smith's Charley likewise layed the offering of "Lefty" Hartman in the form of one single and one sippy two-bagger. Charley's smasher was responsible for two of the six runs. Charley let 'em hit—three times.

Hitting Averages Fattened

Most of the Pirates fattened their hitting averages yesterday against Pasco's ace in the hole. By the way, Hartman was in a hole most of the time.

Rube Davis got two smashes out of three times at bat, Charley batted 500, Theison got two connections, Peckham laid out two singles and a lousy three-bagger that would have been good for a circuit trip on a drier day, and McInnis, Knight, Peterson and Rosenbaum all got a single. Peckham's smashing three-base hit was the hardest drive of the day, although Cunningham, Pasco center fielder, laid out a three-base hit nearly as far.

Pasco Scores First

At 2:20 o'clock, with the atmosphere anything but dry and the diamond a playground for ducks, Pidecock decided that half an hour should elapse before decision as to whether the battle would be called or not. At 3 o'clock the diamond was in the same shape but no rain was falling so the officials decided that he might as well tell 'em to "play ball."

The first inning went scoreless although the Pirates laid the bases cluttered up. A double play, in connection with a forced run, retired the Pirates. Four ballplayers faced Bench.

In the second inning, Pasco, helped by a walk, a fielder's choice, and a single by Shelby, scored. Sielhard, Bench whiffed the fifth man up. The Pirates started out to make it up. Peckham singled, Theison connected with a two-base drive and Bench, with a husky smash to right field, scored Peckham and Theison.

In the third La Grande scored two more. Peterson went to first on an error, Alexander grounded out to second, Davis sacrificed Peterson to third, Peckham and Theison singled and then Rosenbaum brought the two in with a long single. Bench grounded out to Pichee. Three men faced Bench in the third and fourth inning.

In the sixth frame Charley became kind hearted and generous and let Cunningham and Knowles get a three-bagger and a two-bagger respectively. Hartman scored.

With the score 4-2 in favor of La Grande in the seventh inning singled, Peckham brought him in with a three-base hit and came home on a sacrifice by Theison. For Pasco, nine men faced Bench in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings.

Next Sunday La Grande plays Pasco at Pasco, Wash. Walla Walla entertains the Buckaroos at Walla Walla, Wash., and Millou journeys to Dayton, Wash.

WORK FINALLY STARTED TO RAISE GERMAN FLEET

LONDON (INS)—Following nearly a year of negotiating for armistice, work has finally begun on the raising of the scuttled German grand fleet from the depths of Brest Bay, Scotland.

The first vessel to be salvaged, a torpedo boat lying in 16 fathoms, is expected to be raised in two weeks. The whole project is expected to occupy about eight years, and the biggest proposition will come when the salvagers attempt to raise the Hindenburg of 27,000 tons displacement.

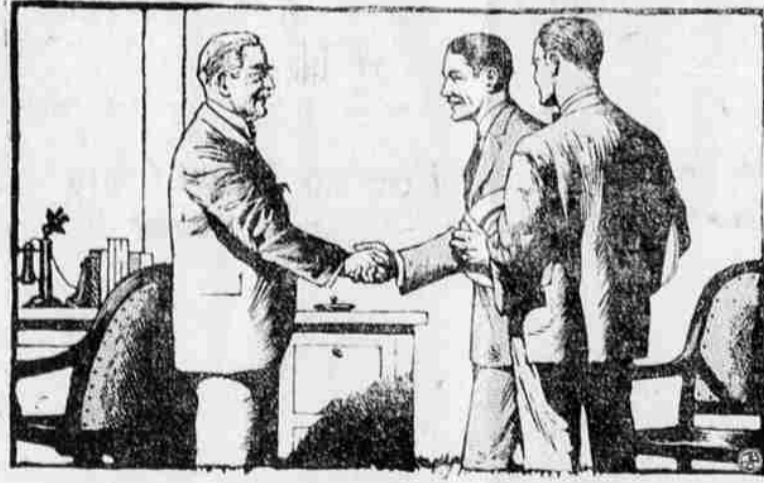
