### LABOR IDEALS MADE PUBLIC

A. F. of L. Lays Down Basis on Which It Will Measure Men, Parties and Platforms.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The American Federation of Labor Tuesday enumerated the demands on which it will measure men, parties and platforms during the coming campaign.

First of all, it set forth a "test of the spirit of honesty, integrity and high-mindedness in public office" is necessary.

"Astounding revelations of the past few months," are referred to as proof of the need of a "great degeneration of American idealism" in public life.

Other things enumerated deal with limitations of labor welfare; taxation; the soldier bonus; international relations; curbing the power of the supreme court; immigration; abolition of the railroad labor board and the desire for world peace.

The declaration which was made by the executive committee of the American Federation of Labor nonpartisan political campaign committee, was signed by Samuel Gompers, president; Frank Morrison, secretary; and James O'Connell, head of the metal trades department.

**Protection for Helpless**  
It has demanded laws to "protect the helpless," to abolish special privilege and to free industry for the working out of its purely domestic problems; and to "make government responsive to the needs of the people and to deprive courts of the power to rule as well as to adjudicate."

"We need less 'thou shalt not' in our laws," it says. "We need more law that helps get things done and less law that stops legitimate constructive effort." Asserting it to be the purpose of labor to carry forward the great victories of the past, the declaration says revelations that "steal the imagination have been witnessed and that representatives of reaction and special privilege have fought to protect the enemies of the public welfare."

"More men must come into office," it continues, "who will serve the people faithfully and who will not be turned aside from the path of public duty."

Among the demands for legislation, the first is for a permanent immigration policy.

"Regardless of the outcome in connection with immigration legislation now before congress," the declaration says, "a policy of strict exclusion is imperative for many years to come. The more nearly the United States can come to absolute exclusion, the better. We are able to maintain and improve American standards of living and of American lives and citizenship. It is imperative that America have time and opportunity to develop an American race."

The declaration calls for adoption of the child labor amendment which has been reported both in the senate and house; and insisted on adjusted compensation for world war veterans.
