SPORT EVENT TO BE GIVEN

First Annual Eastern Oregon Sportsmen's Exposition to Be in Baker Late This Month

BAKER, Ore. (Special)—The first annual Eastern Oregon Sportsmen's Exposition to be held in Baker May 22, 23, 24 and 25 will be one of the biggest shows of outdoor life of the northwest as indicated in reports made at a meeting of Baker County Rod and Gun Club, sponsors of the show. Enthusiastic response and cooperation of federal game and forest departments, of state officers, and of individual exhibitors has been greatly in evidence, members said. The Baker Natatorium will be turned into a veritable mountain scene for the four days, with the pool, miniature lake. The tank will be drained, filled with artificial water, and even the lake's shores will be made to look down and see trout, beavers, and every kind of waterfowl actually living as they do in the open. The balcony will be equipped with exhibits including birds, animals, forestry work, and other phases of outdoor life, while the main auditorium will be converted into a big outdoor camp, and will include deer, bear and other seasonal exhibits. Shows Scheduled. Trapshooters from all over the northwest will take part in the shoot arranged for Sunday, May 22. Entry blanks will be mailed out shortly. Unusual in that it has never before been tried in this section, a flycasting tournament will be scheduled for some day during the exposition. Another feature of the four-day operation will be the dog show, where leading exhibitors of the northwest will enter sporting dogs, several puppies, direct descendants of the police dog, St. Bernard, of motion picture fame, have been promised by an Idaho exhibitor.

Pacific Coast Observer Reports Scarcity of Thunder Storms

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—A strip of the Pacific coast between British Columbia and Lower California, taking in the cities of Seattle, Tacoma, Portland, San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego, has fewer thunder storms than any other section of the United States, according to officials of the Weather Bureau. J. A. Beal, United States meteorologist here, pointed out that the reason for this, roughly speaking, is that the rains along the coast come mostly in winter, when atmospheric conditions are less favorable for the generation of electricity. The thunder storms of the interior states, and along the Atlantic coast, happen largely in spring and summer, he explained, when there are warm rains.

Japan Imports Glider

TOKYO (AP)—A 15-meter glider is to be imported from France by the aviation experimental bureau of the Imperial University. A French expert will accompany the machine and instruct Japanese airmen in its navigation.
