parties of gypsies hoping to find Ardie Macs, four-year-old Seattle lad, but found no trace of him.

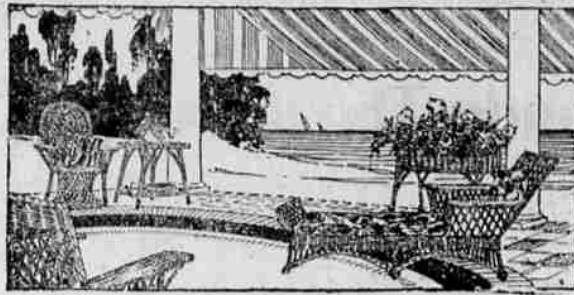

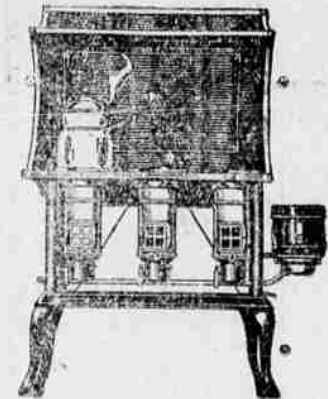
