

OPEN GOLFING TOURNAMENT SOON

National Championship
to Be Played on Oak-
land Hills Country Club
Course in June.

DETROIT, Mich. (AP)—The golf course at the Oakland Hills country club, where the national open championship will be played June 5 and 6, is regarded by expert golfers as providing about the best test of golfing of any course in the country. Deceiving distances, shifting winds and fairways that are well trapped are some of the handicaps that test players unfamiliar with the links, and even those who have played over the course before must be on their game, or they will find themselves in trouble.

The total yardage of the course is 6,771 and par is 72. Always there is a wind. Most often it is from the west, an aid to the player on the first and second holes but dead against him on 7, 8 and 9, while on the other never constant, shifting frequently enough to make the course a different test entirely, even on the same day.

The difficulty found by most golfers lies in the deceiving distances, resulting in underclubbing shots. Although the fairways are wide and rolling they are trapped wide, and shots that are wide are sure to cause the golfer who makes them considerable trouble.

Number 1 hole of 438 yards calls for a down hill drive, with deep traps about halfway down either side of the fairway to catch hooks and slices. Number 2 hole in the woods, with a wide trap running across the fairway to catch topped drives. No. 3, 199 yards, is the first short hole. No. 4 is an elbow hole and measures 410 yards.

The drive from No. 5 tee calls for a carry over a slight hill, and the same condition prevails on the next hole. Number 5 is 425 yards and No. 6 is 254. From No. 7 tee the drive is from one hill to another with a brook, which also crosses No. 5, ready to catch a hooked second shot. This hole is 323 yards. The green on No. 8 is higher than the tee by 70 feet. The green is a narrow affair with about 25 feet, in a gradual rise. No. 9 is higher than the tee by a steep bank in back. The hole is 455 yards.

Number 9 hole is only 250 yards, but any curve either to right or left from the fairway takes the ball into traps. The 450 yard No. 10 and the 350 yard No. 11 require careful drives and second shots to avoid hazards. The No. 12 hole of 550 yards is the longest of the 18 and regarded as the most difficult. The drive is from a hill into a valley, with a pond at the right about 200 yards from the tee. A shot is apt to go into the water, while on the left is long grass. Par for the hole is 130.

The 130 yard No. 13 is negotiated with a malleable pitch to the green which is surrounded by sand traps. The drive on No. 14 calls for a carry of 175 yards over a marsh. The hole is 475 yards. Number 15 hole of 330 yards is another elbow and No. 16, measuring 300 yards, is one of the most picturesque and difficult of the course. Number 17 is another short hole (183 yards) with a par three, and No. 18, which is 470 yards, is an elbow calling for a good second shot to follow the drive.

NEW YORK, (AP)—Judging from the returns on the first few weeks of the National League race, the reported ineptitude of our Mr. McGraw's pitchers is something of a bedtime story. The Giants' present position in the race, far from being attributed to spots of their pitching, is due to the reality in the work of McGraw's selected work staff. Good pitching alone won't get the first ten games played.

In support of this statement the writer need only refer you to the official averages with the remark that one cannot go behind figures any more than one can go behind the nose of his nose. The average over the period in question showed the Giants running an indifferent but not club batting. It might also be mentioned that a team can win ten games only through hitting and pitching, consequently, adding two and two, one arrives at the conclusion that pitchers carried the Giants to the top of the percentage table.

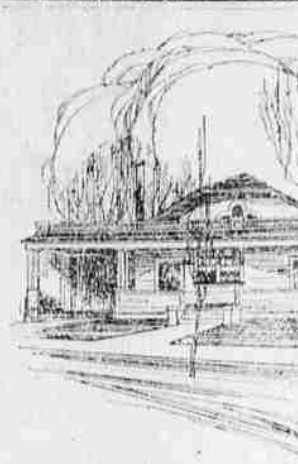
England Blamed for Ill-
