WORTH OF CAR GROWING MORE

SPokane, Wash. (AP)—W. W. Roberts, a 72-year-old motorist of Spokane, is the owner of an automobile which, in his estimation, and in direct contrast to a great percentage of vehicles, increases rather than depreciates in value as it grows older.

Seventeen years ago Mr. Roberts purchased the machine, a 1907 four-seated model, at a cost of \$800. Recently the manufacturer of this make of automobile offered him \$2,000 for it, as they desired to use it for exhibition purposes.

After owning the car for 17 years, Mr. Roberts decided he did not wish to part with it. Power developed from a one-cylinder motor which cranks by means of a detachable handle at the left side of the front seat. According to the owner, the engine runs as smoothly as when new and is sufficiently powerful to negotiate all ordinary grades.

"I never have had a part replaced and have made only minor repairs," Mr. Roberts said. "With the exception of the tires, the car is the same today as when I bought it in 1907."

"The machine never has been in a wreck and never has broken down or even stalled in a pinch. Recently I was offered \$2,000 for it by the manufacturer who wanted it for exhibition purposes. But I don't want the money and I don't want to part with the old car, which I have driven continuously for 14 years."

Dog Fanciers Plan to Stage Field Trials

SPokane, Wash. (AP)—Dog fanciers of Spokane plan to form an organization for the purpose of holding field trials and have been secured for a course, according to an announcement by C. H. Macdonald, a fancier of this city.

The Spokane County Sportsmen's association has passed a resolution endorsing the movement.

Locations for the course are being considered and according to Mr. Macdonald, it may be established in Idaho, as the state line is only about 15 miles east of here.

"The trials will probably be held over the life in Idaho," he said. "We have excellent grounds near Spokane and can find a splendid course."
