CARIBOU APPRECIATE MAN'S EFFORTS AT PROTECTION

WILLIAM T. LOPP, Alaska. (AP)—The Alaska division of the bureau of education, predicts that staid efforts at herding will result in the domestication of the wild caribou roving Alaska in hundreds of thousands.

When the caribou learn that man will shield them from predatory animals and provide them with protected ranges they will become tame, in the opinion of Dr. Lopp.

Some caribou herds already have become, in a measure, domestic. They often mingle for weeks with the domestic reindeer herds and gradually learn there is nothing to fear from the fur-clad Eskimos who hover near to keep away wolves and other beasts of prey.

SEALS MOVE NORTHWARD—COLDHOVA, Alaska. (AP)—Seal herds have started to move north earlier this year than usual, according to the captain of vessels plying the North Pacific ocean. Large bands have been noticed off Cape Blanco, Cal. The Coast Guard cutter Snohomish has received orders to patrol with the seal herds to Dixon Entrance.

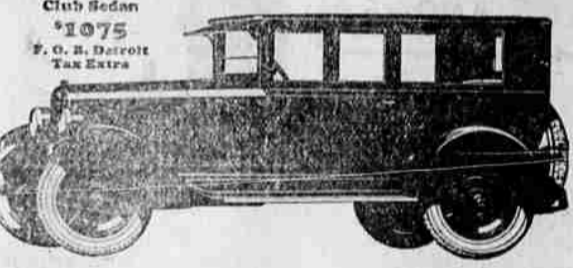
