Mrs. A. E. Ivanhoe, present incumbent of the office of county superintendent, who is a candidate for re-nomination today based on following statement to the voters: I am asking for the support and the vote of the people of Union county. For sixteen years you have known me as a teacher, both in the grades and high school, and I spent one year as a critic teacher in the Oregon State normal. Only one of these little ones is of school age and has attended the public school in La Grande since the death of her mother. Both of my sons were educated in the public schools of La Grande.

One word more: I am indeed

an American. My great grandfather fought in the Revolutionary war for the principle on which our Democracy is founded. I have been a member of the Presbyterian church for thirty years and can say from my heart that I love your children and for the sake of these children, who are indeed my friends, I hope I may be sustained in this office.

All efficient teachers in Union county also know they have my unqualified support and assistance, and to promote their welfare in my greatest delight.

Little science for the Demos from that lot of names, if adaptability for fixing to fancy phrases is to be the deciding factor in the selection. Wherefore, Democrats will decline to fight an alliterative battle with the G. O. P. and will answer the Republican challenge to "keep Cool with Coolidge" by retorting: "Why put the county in 'Cold Storage'?" Much has been written about the likelihood of a third party, headed by Senator La Follette, but beyond picking the fighting men,

for from Wisconsin as the probable presidential nominee there has been little speculation as to the supporting personnel in the leadership of such party. Harriet Stanton Hatch, daughter of Elizabeth Cady Stanton, pioneer suffragist, suggests that women who find difficulty in adjusting themselves to the politics and principals of the two old parties, which still function chiefly from the masculine viewpoint, seize the opportunity to get in on the ground floor in the La Follette party. To make the party truly progressive, in its recognition of equal suffrage as well as in its attitude toward other fundamentals, she says second place on the ticket might properly be filled by a woman, and suggests Jane Addams as a vice-presidential candidate, who would draw thousands of women's votes to the La Follette party. "We women should forget any idea of a 'woman's party,'" says Mrs. Hatch. "The time has gone by for women to talk about getting things for women. That is played

out. We must work for the things that are good for all humanity, not just for women alone." Vermonters in Washington, at a "Maple Sugar Party" thrown by Senator Porter Dale, whooped things up for Val Coolidge, Plymouth, Vt. boy, as a candidate for president. A "sweet" time was had by all. Others in Langley Case Given Two Years COVINGTON, (AP)—Moses Lipschultz, of Philadelphia, convicted with Congressman Langley, was sentenced to two years in the Atlanta penitentiary. The same sentence was imposed upon M. D. Huth, of Alliance, Ohio, and Walter H. Carrer, of Canton, Ohio, indicted with Langley and Lipschultz, who pleaded guilty to charges during the trial. Langley will not resign as congressman, his attorneys announced.
