Timepieces Lead in Swiss Exports to United States

BERNE (AP)—Swiss exports to the United States during the first two months of this year amounted to \$2,556,000, Swiss francs.

The district of St. Gall with its exportation of embroidery to America, lost the position of first place, to watches and watch parts, which amounted during the two months to \$2,000,000 francs, embroidery reaching only \$2,000,000, 80% and silk goods came next with \$1,500,000 francs, cheese, \$225,000, cotton goods, \$239,000, aluminum \$220,000, hats \$169,000 and shoes sent to the United States \$75,000 francs.

SMOKE SCREEN HIDES N. Y.

NEW YORK (AP)—An imaginary fleet of hostile battleships lying in New York bay were quickly and completely thwarted in their evil plot to level into the dust the famous skyline of this towering metropolis the other day.

by the United States air service. Lieutenant Delvaux Meyers, American army aviator, and Captain Hartnett, of the Chemical warfare service of the army, built a wall of dense, evil-smelling smoke, two feet high, about the city in its time, and in a manner so effective as to completely obscure New York's towering skyscrapers from the enemy.

General Fries, chief of the chemical warfare section of the army, declared himself to be completely satisfied with the results of the test.

Their aim and coordination, confused by the billowy waves of

smoke, there being doubt that hundreds of hypothetical shells from the imaginary battleships aimed at the Woolworth tower and the Metropolitan building, fell into the enemy's hands.

Four planes participated in the test—two giant Martin bombers bearing the screening apparatus and official observers, and two biplanes carrying photographers. The Martin biplane, equipped with the smoke tanks, was piloted by Lieutenant Meyers. In the other Martin were Captain H. C. Eaker, pilot, and Captain W. H. Wells, observer. The second Corps area headquarters. The test was under the direction of Major Henry, commanding Mitchell field.

Thousands Saw Test

Airplanes have become an everyday occurrence now, and the thousands of persons gazing from the decks of the municipal ferries, failed to see anything significant in four planes in close formation which came sliding down from the heights above Manhattan to about 700 feet above the East River at the Brooklyn Bridges. Here Captain Hartnett, of the Chemical Warfare Service, dropped a trail of "Titanium Chloride" in the wake of the biplane which spread across the bay between Governors Island and the lower end of Manhattan.

The thousands of on-lookers then beheld an awesome phenomenon. Those on the ferries, caught in the midst of the screen, thought they had suddenly run into an impenetrable London fog, one that bore all the queer smells and colors peculiar to the English product.

Smoke 700 Feet High

Those in Battery Park saw the smoke on the bay gradually fade away and disappear as the huge man-made cloud dropped to the water and then floated slowly upward making a wall of smoke 700 feet high.

Then, to test the penetrability of the screen by an enemy airplane, Captain Eaker's biplane was flown through the screen. Captain Meyers, who rode with Captain Eaker, explained his sensations as follows:

"My ship got a lot of it. A flagpole suddenly seemed to be in each of my hand. I thought we were going to collide, some down-draft surface, but Captain Eaker merely said 'Hold up' and we skidded the top of the Whitehall building."

The test proved successful in spite of the strong wind blowing.

Earthquake Cooked Tokyo Bay

TOKYO (AP)—Water in the bay of Tokyo is colder this year than last, according to observations of the Marine Products Agency. The earthquake of last September being blamed for a marked drop in the temperature. The lower temperature of water about the coast near Tokyo is expected to hinder such industries as fishing for shell fish and gathering of seaweeds, in which the workers are obliged to spend long hours standing in the water.
