HAWAII HAS CRACK TEAM

Swimming Sharks to Represent Islands at the Olympic Tryouts.

HONOLULU, (AP)—The name Kahanamoku, of potent magic in the swimming world since 1912 when Duke Kahanamoku went from Hawaii to the Stockholm Olympiad and carried the colors of the United States to victory in the 100-meter freestyle swim, may shine with renewed luster this year, according to swimming authorities here.

Sam, younger brother of the Duke, is counted upon to revive the fame of the Kahanamoku family. He has been chosen as one of the members of the squad to be sent by the Hawaiian A. A. U. to the sectional tryouts on the mainland.

Sam is a freestyle swimmer and also has several fast breaststroke performances to his credit. He is 15 years old. His best freestyle performance was 190 meters open water in 1:00 2-5, a Hawaiian record and only one-fifth of a second over Duke's Olympic record.

The other members of the swimming squad are:

Marichon Wehachou, holder of the world's woman's freestyle tank record of 1:20 for 100 meters.

Henry Luning, with a 100-meter backstroke record of 1:12 4-5, one-fifth of a second slower than the world's record.

William Kirchbaum, breaststroke swimmer with a performance of 2:02 1-3 for 200 meters.

Warren Keatola, holder of the world's 100-meter backstroke record of 1:12 2-5.

Charles Pang, son of Ho Sui Pang, Chinese who has played baseball in the senior league here for the past 25 years.

Pua Keatola, member of the 1920 American freestyle Olympic relay team and second to Duke Kahanamoku in the 100-meter race at Stockholm.

Members of the track and field squad include: Milton Carter, of Hills, holder of the island high jump record of 5 feet 11 1-4 inches, established this year; Richard Gartley, formerly of Yale, holder of the island pole-vault record at 12 feet 7-8 inches, established this year; and John Watt, formerly of Cornell University, holder of the island 120-yard high hurdle record of 15 2-8 seconds.

Uruguay Suffering From Duel Epidemic

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay (INS)—Duels, which have been an everyday matter among the most prominent people of the social and political circles of Uruguay, are now staged three and even four times a day and are causing great concern to the police authorities of this country.

According to Lay, any Uruguayan citizen is free to challenge anybody to a duel, and the only thing the police can do to stop it when the duels are discovered on the "field of honor" and before the duel has actually started.

Even Dr. Baltazar Bruin, while President of the Republic, was challenged and resigned his office to wipe off the offense with the point of a sword. Naturally, Dr. Bruin was recalled to office after the incident, and this gave encouragement to other officials to fight duels.

Now, however, certain police regulations have been enforced against duels, so anybody who feels that his honor is at stake has to cross the River Plata and go to Buenos Aires, with his sword and a case of swords and slightly wound his opponent whereupon he feels satisfied, shakes hands with the former enemy, and the reunited parties proceed to celebrate the occasion with a "blow out" in the best restaurant in town.

FALL LAID TO MOVIE SHOWS

Bishops Play the Silver Screen for Making Irish Girls "Regular Devils."

(By DANIEL O'CONNELL) DUBLIN (INS)—Irish girls "are becoming regular devils," according to Dr. O'Doherty, the Bishop of Galway, and Hollywood (California) is chiefly to blame.

Preaching at a recent confirmation service at Galway, the bishop had a few plain words to say about the way the young folk of today carry on, and he attributed the breakdown in the morals of the younger generation to the pernicious influence of the silver screen. As a cure, he suggested that parents resort to the good old-fashioned remedy of spanking their daughters to curb their wayward tendencies.

"Hollywood," the plain-spoken bishop declared, "is a den of vice and immorality, and most of the heroes and heroines put on the screen for your admiration are people without sense of religion or morality. Good pictures are a magnificent influence in any community, but the unfortunate thing is that the people engaged in the production of pictures are without morals. They do things in scenes that are calculated to undermine the most steadfast. They seek to make money at the price of the souls of these good boys and girls we see around us."

Having spoken his mind about the movies, the bishop turned his attention to the general deterioration which, he declares, has taken place in the morals of the Irish people.

"The physical as well as the moral strength of the people of Ireland is being broken down by all-night dances and drinking is frequent in the intervals between dances," he asserted. "We used to have a reputation for the modesty of our girls and the purity and manliness of our men. It is alarming that the loss of virtue and chastity appears to be growing apace."

"I have the greatest respect for the virtue of Irish girls, but I know some of them are becoming regular devils. Where I do place the blame? First of all, on the girls themselves. The girls will tell you that the boys led them astray, but it is the experience of many that if it were not for the purity of our Irish boys there would be far more scandals than there are. People talk a lot of nonsense about innocent girls. The blame lies upon the girls themselves. They are not innocent, and they are not misled."

"There is great responsibility, however, on the fathers and mothers who will not control their young people, who let them out at night to ramble in the roads and lanes and to linger in the gateways. I say to fathers if their girls do not obey them lay the lash upon their backs. That was the old system, and it should be the system today."

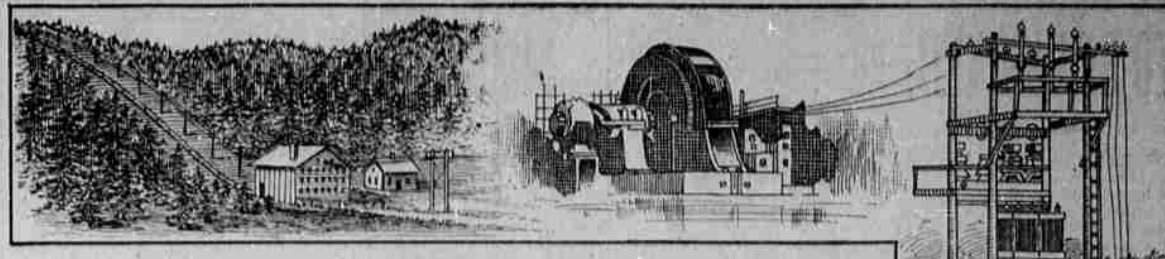
"Mothers should tell their daughters of their failings and should not cherish the notion that 'my little girl cannot do anything wrong.' Some day they will find that their 'little girl' has gone wrong."

Newspaper Writer Is Jailed in Argentine

BUENOS AIRES, (INS)—For the first time in the history of the Argentine press the question of the freedom of the press has arisen in court. A newspaperman sentenced to two years in jail was the result.

Senor Francisco Mendez Cabañada, a prominent Buenos Aires newspaperman, was the Province of Mendoza as traveling correspondent, allowed himself to comment rather vividly on the political situation in that state, and for this offense was arrested and sentenced to a term in jail. It had been taken for granted right along that anything said in a newspaper was free from legal action, but the Governor of Mendoza has found it otherwise, and has brought suit on behalf of the state against the writer.

"Constitutional governments, their officials and all provincial institutions organized under the laws of Mendoza cannot be attacked by the press, because they represent the law, and an attack against them is an attack against the law, and, therefore, a crime."

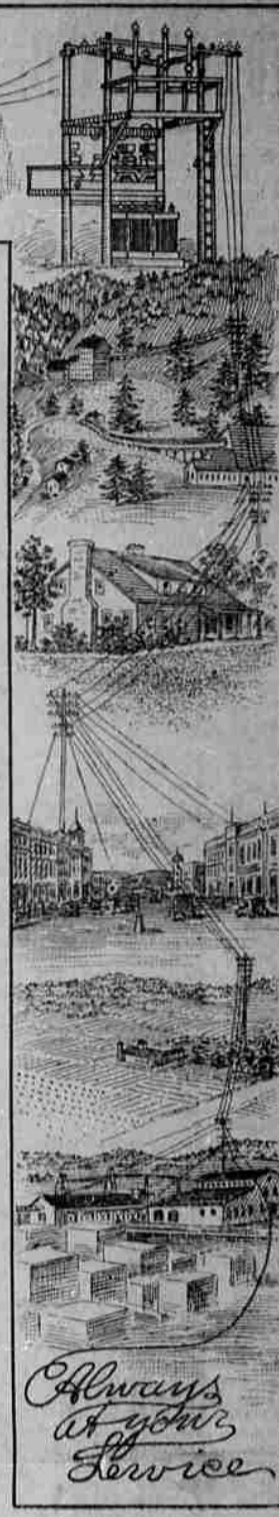

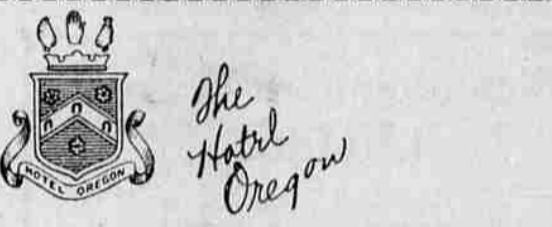

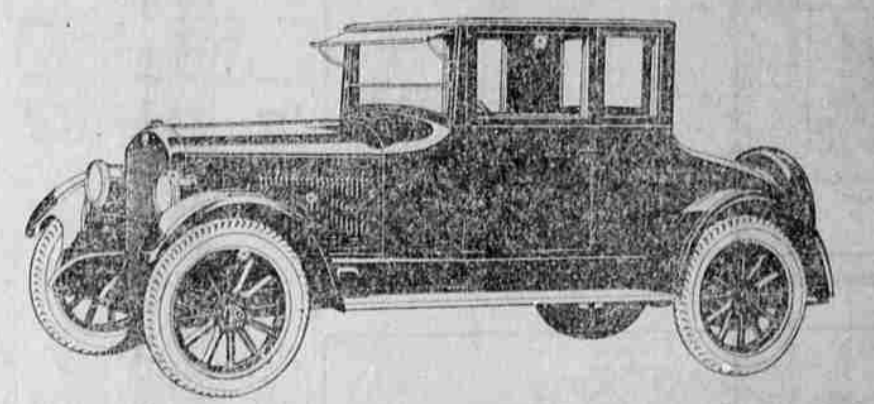
