**History of Northwest To Be Pageant Theme**

WALLA WALLA, Wash., (AP)—The pageant history of the Pacific Northwest, from the advent of the Lewis and Clark expedition party in 1805 to the building of the first western railroad in 1875, will be recaptured in a huge community drama here May 25 and 26.

"How the West Was Won" is the title of the pioneer pageant. Last year it attracted an audience of 2,200 in over 100 cities. This year, with a cast of 2,200 in over 100 cities, it promises to be a more ambitious production than ever before. The pageant is entirely a community enterprise, with residents of the Walla Walla valley and the neighboring states of Oregon and Idaho participating. The cast includes 100 male chorists, 500 juvenile singers, 100 dancers, 250 Indians, a band and an orchestra. Scores of persons in the cast are descendants of the pioneers who chartered the original drama.

The pageant opens with the coming of the Lewis and Clark party, followed closely by the Hudson's Bay company, the traders and the August Whitman missionary party. The great wagon train of 1842, with its hundreds of emigrants who decided the ownership of the Pacific Northwest in favor of the United States, will be shown, and the Whitman massacre of November 29 and 30, 1847, will be dramatized in a melodrama by 400 dancers. The Grand Council of 1855 will be depicted by 250 Indians.

**Japan Begins Electrification of Important Railway Lines**

YOKOHA, (AP)—The Japanese plan to electrify the important Government railway of Japan for the introduction of electricity. The power on at the government railroads of the country will begin to be put into effect this year. An appointment of an electrician bureau within the ministry of parliament marks an actual beginning on the program.

The railway department will begin electrification with the Tokyo-Yokohama line.
