RODENT FIGHT IS CARRIED ON

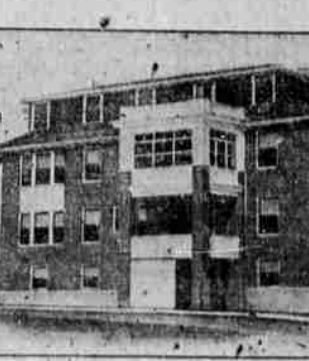
Wallowa Farmers Experimenting with Calcium Cyanide Mixture to Kill Squirrels.

WALLOWA, Ore., (Special)—The ground squirrels have been moving into the grain fields in great numbers during the past couple of weeks. Many large patches and tracts of range land which was not poisoned over early in the spring, afforded them an excellent place in which to raise the young. The dry weather having caused the grass to become tough and dry, they moved in search of better range. Some of the prominent wheat raisers have been down by Prof. R. J. Balke, and his agricultural class, here during the past few weeks demonstrating along this line will be carried out in the county next week, by men connected with the biological survey. The first of the week demonstrations will be made in the eastern part of the county, and in this section May 21.

This method of combating the rodents is said to have proved very effective in eastern Washington, where it has been used quite extensively, resulting in about 95 per cent extermination over the areas fully treated. Chetum exsicc is a flakey substance, of which from one to one and a half ounces is placed in a burrow, when coming in contact with moisture gives off a deadly gas of sufficient strength to kill the squirrels. For the large timber squirrels and ground-hogs, somewhat larger quantities are needed. The cost is estimated to be somewhere near the same as where poisoning is done with poison grain. In the smaller quantities, which has been used here,

The new poison material has cost about 24c per pound. It is said to be considerably cheaper in large quantities. A number of the farmers, have been favorably impressed with the results obtained from the use of it, and are planning on trying out. It is thought this method of combating the squirrels will prove very effective, when used early in the spring, or when the young rodents are small. In this way the entire crop may be killed off at one operation. A considerable quantity of poisoned grain has been prepared for use in poisoning grain.
