Beauty Hints

IN THE SPRING—ENAMELED WARE PAELS

A woman who believes in taking advantage of all the winter sales of housewives' utensils was wandering through an enameled-ware department recently. Her attention was arrested by two women, one of whom was buying four enameled-ware water pails. Her companion said: "When you live in a city and have water on every floor, what do you want with four water pails?" To which the buyer replied: "In the first place, spring cleaning is not far away, and I know by long experience that nothing is so convenient to use, nor such a saving of labor, at that strenuous time, as water pails—one for scrub water and one for rinsing water. With four pails two people can work at once with great saving of time." "Besides," she continued, "when the first mild spring weather comes, not warm enough to begin with ice and yet mild enough to worry a bit about milk and such things, I find very cold water in an enameled-ware pail an excellent refrigerator. Milk cans and jars of butter, set in the pail, will keep sweet, and there is no danger of the enameled ware being rusted, as is the case when metal pails are used."

A New Way to Cook Rice

South Carolinians think they know all about rice and the methods by which it may be prepared. Nevertheless, a South Carolinian admitted at a Sunday supper recently that he was obliged to come north to meet the combination of rice and apples. As he highly approved of the novel dish it may be taken for granted that it will be welcomed in other quarters. It, moreover, has the advantage of being easily prepared and of being fully as good when warmed over as when fresh. Boil an enameled-ware hunk dish and put in three or four cupfuls of rice and one cupful of sugar, half a teaspoonful of cinnamon and a little grated nutmeg. Just before putting in the oven, pour over two tablespoonfuls of cold water. Cook in a slow oven until the apples are very thoroughly cooked into the rice. If it is more convenient, this dish can be prepared at noon and heated again for supper.

Bright Stockings Are Now Picadilly Vogue

LONDON. (INS)—Clothes of knitted silk and wool and "all-in-one" stockings, in many startling colors and designs, are features of the summer styles in Picadilly.

Women suits have never been so beautiful. Wonderful dresses, that seem studded with precious metal when the wearers move, have threaded into their silk texture gold and silver lines. Coats are embroidered with patterns executed by artists.

Knitted garments have been made to fulfill a woman's dress needs from breakfast to dinner. Prices have soared, and the plain knitted woolen suit which used to be an economy has become as gorgeous as to be now an extravagance.

Woolen caps that can be brushed until the ends are as fluffy as a curly head have been manufactured for seaside wear. They give the effect of wigs and can be bought in many alarming colors, from mauve to orange.

Stockings are still to be light in color. Sunburn stockings are the correct wear for the summer, and a woman, to be perfectly dressed, must wear hosiery that corresponds in shade to the exact tone of the face on her face. Shiny, dainty, shot-silk stockings and others with luminous clocks and lace imitations, while there are stockings of gold and silver metal tissue for evening wear.

Many hats are trimmed with pearls. Fan-shaped hats, lavishly trimmed with flowers, promise to be popular.

Suede gloves, trimmed with large head motifs or edged with colors and cut into petals so that the edges look like flowers, are among the dress accessories.

WOMEN POLICE TO BE ON DUTY

Lady Coppers Will Guard the Democratic National Convention from Adventurers.

NEW YORK (AP)—One of the many problems New York's police force will face during the democratic convention next month will be to rid the city of characters known in police vernacular as "crashers" and "mashers." This task has been assigned to Captain Mary Hamilton, director of the feminine blue coats. A crasher is a person, male or female, who craves excitement, company and entertainment and, not having the funds or the connections necessary for a legitimate satisfaction of the craving becomes addicted to polite "sponging."

The chronic crasher and masher, according to Captain Hamilton, are always seen at large public functions, political demonstrations, banquets, theatrical first-night big funerals, art exhibits and society weddings. They dress well. Their manners are irreproachable. They are, to all appearances, the acme of culture and refinement. In fact, they sometimes outshine the company they keep in these respects. Captain Hamilton knows dozens of them.

Strangely enough, the crashers are mostly women. But that other bane of the metropolis, the masher, is usually a male, as Captain Hamilton testifies and as police court records bear ample witness. "Sometimes we call them crashers," she explained. "We also know them, however, as 'chow-chasers' or 'outsiders' or 'bean-pickers'."

"How do we spot them? Well, perhaps a hostess will call upon us to oust an unwanted guest, or the guest at a hotel banquet finds her seat usurped by a stranger, and calls a house detective who in turn calls my department. Sometimes we are asked to escort them from theaters. Once we see one of them we don't forget, and we find the same faces turning up everywhere."

It has been Captain Hamilton's experience that big conventions bring out the crashers in full force. The entertainment functions are so large, so few of the guests are acquainted with each other that the way of the usurper is easy. He, or she, takes in everything on the program, dinners, theaters, auto tours, boat excursions, sightseeing rides, all free. There will be all these during the forthcoming convention. And every crasher in New York will have a full date-book.

But Captain Hamilton will be ready for them for, as she says, "My force has its rogues' gallery well in mind, and orders will be to eject, either by persuasion or by force, every crasher we spot at any of the convention doings."

Hints for the Housewife

HOW TO BOIL FISH WHELP

Fish is an important article of diet, but some people find fresh fish difficult to digest. A codfish, just while it is very nice fried, is more digestible boiled. It used to be difficult to boil a codfish steak (even when wrapped in a cloth) without breaking, but in the small oval enameled ware boilers which are provided with a tray, cod and halibut steak can be cooked perfectly with no trouble. Lift the tray with the codfish upon it out of the kettle and slip the fish off on the platter. A very nice sauce for boiled fish, and a change from the regulation cream sauce, is made by cooking canned tomatoes in an enameled ware saucepan until very soft. Rub through a sieve with an enameled ware spoon, add a teaspoonful of butter, salt and pepper to taste; then pour over the fish.

Union Oil Company Strikes Another Well

LOS ANGELES (Special)—That the Union Oil Company of California has opened up the most promising oil field discovered in this state since Santa Fe Springs came in three years ago is freely voiced here as a result of the bringing in of Athens No. 1 recently with a flow of the lightest gravity oil on the Pacific coast.

The Athens well is located at 120th and Figueroa streets, and is within the city limits of Los Angeles. It was drilled to 4571 feet. Production is now coming from a very small opening and tests are gravity. The yield is 1000 barrels per day, although this could be increased by opening the well up.

War Widows Popular as Brides

LONDON (AP)—There are today 100,000 fewer war-widows in the British Isles than there were just after the armistice. This is due mostly to their having remarried, though many have died. There are still 46,000 widows on the books of the pensions ministry, but every year sees the number decreasing. Many of these women are comparatively young and a cash gratuity which they get upon marrying again probably makes them more attractive to the marrying man than a single girl without any such dowry.
