PRINCE SAVED FROM CANCER

Briton Makes Long Journey to Cure Indian Noble of Dread Growth.

LONDON, (U. N. S.)—One of the longest and most remarkable journeys ever undertaken to perform a surgical operation has just been completed by P. Lockart-Mummery, famous English cancer specialist and chairman of the British Empire Cancer Campaign to wipe out cancer.

He has just returned from the 15,000 miles distant city of Khairatnagar, in India, one of the two forbidden cities in the world, to where he was called to perform an operation on the 70-year-old Maharajah of Nepal in his wonderful palace there.

Strangers are only allowed in Khairatnagar on the express invitation of the Maharajah, and can only leave with his permission. Lockart-Mummery is perhaps the first stranger to have entered the city in this way, and he has brought back some vivid impressions of the journey, the city and its inhabitants and the Maharajah.

When Lockart-Mummery and his assistants arrived at the nearest rail-head, they were met by the Maharajah's representatives with an automobile and three huge elephants, the former for the conveyance of the passengers and the latter for baggage.

Lockart-Mummery describes the journey through the jungle to the palace as "amazing." The passengers being thrown about the automobile during the first day's journey along a dried-up river-bed. Armed guards accompanied the party until the Maharajah had been crowned and the Maharajah's territory was reached.

At the bottom of the Himalayas, the royal caravans awaited them, and they were driven to the royal place, a large palace standing in its own grounds, in appearance like an old English country house.

Describing the Maharajah, Lockart-Mummery says that he was always gorgeously attired and wearing wonderful jewels, whenever he received his visitors. A noticeable jewel was his one earring, an enormous ruby. His five-year-old daughter was always present with him, and she was observed one day on the parade ground leading a regiment of soldiers, with rifle band, round and round the parade.

The palace ladies were good-looking and all very fair. Their lines painted under their eyes and continued to the ears gave them a very amusing appearance. Every one, even the children, had vermillion marks on the forehead, indicating their royal caste.
The visitors found that the city had consisted mainly of temples and palaces, the remainder being stone. The palaces were both huge and gorgeous, with wonderful gardens, fountains and aviaries.
All were painted white inside and out, the floors being laid with white or colored marble. A further instance of the modern West meeting the ancient East was the fact that there is plumbing, with hot and cold water, throughout the palaces, while many places in the city have electric light. The temples are described as being most beautiful and being so numerous that they seem to justify each other everywhere.
The Maharajah's operation is understood to have been successful.
