WILBUR WANTS LARGER NAVY

WASHINGTON: City the Associated Press. — Supporting the contention that the American navy, while stronger than Japan's, is not on a par with Great Britain's, Secretary Wilbur in a lengthy report transmitted Thursday to the house naval committee, declared the comparatively fighting strength of the three navies appeared to be 5-4-3.

The report was in response to a resolution by Representative Britten, Illinois ranking Republican on the committee, which asked whether the 5-5-3 ratio fixed by the Washington arms conference was being maintained as far as the United States is concerned and for detailed information regarding the strength of the American navy.

Indorse Roosevelt's Views

Much of the report was a verbatim repetition of the observations made recently by Assistant Secretary Roosevelt in a letter to Chairman Butler of the committee commenting on statements of W. H. Wheeler, a naval expert that the actual ratio is 5-4-3, with America 5, Great Britain 4, and Japan 3.

The assistant secretary pointed out that the 5-4-3 estimate does not take into consideration strategically located and well-equipped naval bases which greatly add to the sea power of a nation, nor does it take into consideration the relative strength of the various merchant marines.

Mr. Wilbur urged that congress authorize the modernization of 12 battleships—the New York, Texas, Florida, Utah, Arkansas and Wyoming to provide additional deck, torpedo and mine protection for oil instead of coal burning and for "some increased extension of guns," and the New Mexico, Mississippi, Idaho, Pennsylvania, Arizona, Nevada and Louisiana to increase the angle of elevation of guns and to afford additional torpedo protection. He also urged that funds be provided for construction of eight fast cruisers.

Other Nations Building.

The report pointed out that Great Britain is building two battleships and the United States and Japan one; that Great Britain is constructing nine cruisers, Japan 12, France five and the United States two; that Japan is building 27 destroyers, France 24, Great Britain four and the United States none; that Japan has 27 submarines under construction, France 22 the United States 14 and Great Britain six and that England is building three aircraft carriers, the United States and Japan two and France one.

Mr. Wilbur said the United States now has no destroyers because it was ahead of other nations in this respect, although lacking destroyer leaders.

As to submarines, he said, the American navy has none capable of maneuvering with the fleet as battle speed nor at the usual fleet cruiser speed under all conditions of sea and weather.

"We have nearly completed the V-1, 2 and 3, which will be able to keep up with the fleet," said the report. "Our submarines for the purpose for which they are designed are not obsolete before their construction is complete. With the exception of the T class they are not designed for maneuvering with the fleet, and within the limits of the purpose for which they were designed, are reasonably efficient and reliable."

SALISBURY, Ore.—A measure submitted to the voters of Salem at the primary election, authorizing a bond issue in the amount of \$15,000 to purchase additional fire-fighting equipment was approved, according to a report submitted to this council by the city attorney. It previously had been reported that the measure failed because it did not receive a two-thirds majority of the votes cast, as required by the city charter.
