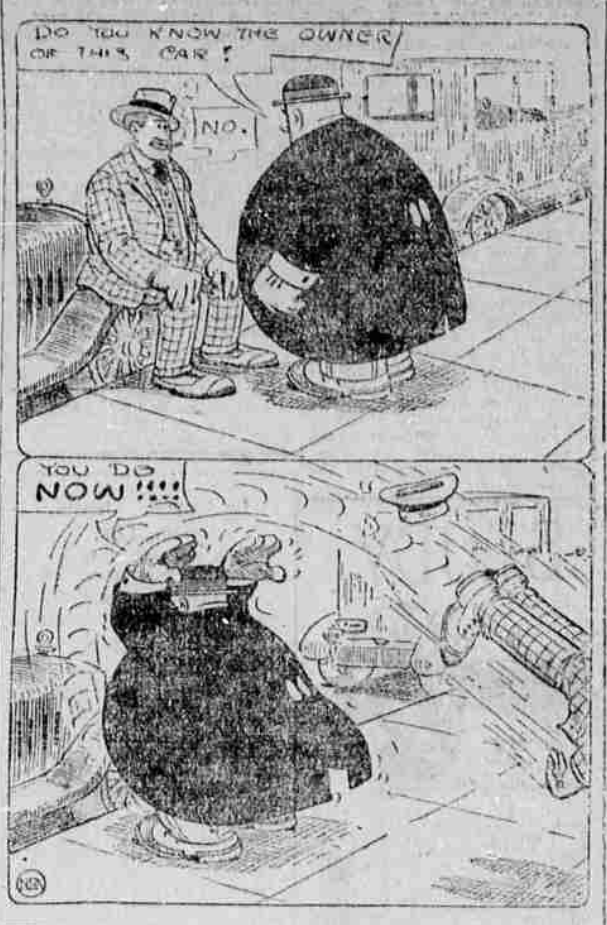

RYAN'S "OLD NEW ENGLAND HOME-STRAND" (AP)—The interior of the Burhill home—here the latest historical acquisition of Henry Ford in New England, is being stripped for reassembly in his colonial museum, the Waverley Inn, in Salisbury, Mass. Ford bought the property from J. Walter Burhill.

The home was erected by Ebenezer Burhill, born in 1679, and for many years it was the social center of the town.

The son of the builder, James Burhill, was appointed chief justice of the Rhode Island supreme court in 1814 and later served in the United States senate. C. Walter Burhill is the grandson of James.
