ret." The paper adds: "We must remember, however, that American principles and honor are different from ours, thus avoiding future disappointment in dealing with Americans."

The Yomiuri urges emigration to Mexico, pointing out that the immigration to restrict such emigration ended with the abrogation of the gentlemen's agreement. This journal proposes a special immigration agreement with Mexico.

Foresees U. S. Expansion
The Yomiuri Choho declares that exclusion forebodes an American policy of expansion toward the Orient. It contends that Japan's submission now will only whet American ambitions.

The Kokumin urges an appeal to the league of nations to show the sincerity of Japan's desire to avoid an eventual clash with the United States.

The Asahi urges the organization of Japanese residents of Manchuria for cooperation with the homeland and for defense of Japan's continental interests.

can tell, but such is the case. Harry Corbett and Jack Clarke broke the spell down in Portland and succeeded in becoming members of the upper house of the state legislature without even so much as looking in a law book, but they carry a charmed existence, for it is the rule to select lawyers, and Milton was one of the selected ones two years ago. the sheriff's custody, as sought by the defense attorneys.

The first round in the legal battle to save the youths from the gallows, into which millions, estimated as high as \$25,000,000, of Leopold's and Loeb's money will be thrown, was intended to permit legal counsel to consult with the prisoners.

The boys talked freely yesterday and took the officers over during the boy into the automobile, telling how they burned the clothing and blanket in which the boy was smothered and buried his shoes and belt, which were uncovered.

Confidence in Money

Young Leopold is sure that money can do anything and through the use of it hopes to avoid the gallows.

The young men were permitted to telephone their parents last night. Loeb, talking with his mother, assured her repeatedly that he had committed murder. Young Loeb assumed a business-like conversation. His father is ill and his mother is dead.

Mrs. Franks, mother of the slain boy, is in a serious condition. She suffered another collapse when she learned that Loeb, a second cousin of Robert Franks, was involved in the killing.

Attorneys Clarence S. Burrow and Benjamin Bachrach, for the defense, told the court today they were principally interested in obtaining authority to confer with the boys. The request was continued until June 27.

Confer With Prisoners

The defense counsel went into conference with the principals and intimated that the two youths

would not be allowed to testify at the inquest.

Leopold today asked a detective to go to his home with a note asking for a pint of gin or whiskey. The note was destroyed.

Crowe stated that the case against Leopold and Loeb was complete except for the finding of the typewriter on which the ransom note was written. He added that two revolvers had been found in Leopold's room.
