DETROIT (Special)—Announcement is made by Walter P. Chrysler, president of the Maxwell-Chrysler-Chalmers board of directors, that J. E. Mr. Fields has been general sales manager and Mr. Zeder chief engineer.

REACTION IN BUSINESS EXPECTED IN ENGLAND

Abolition of the McKenna duties will plunge vital industries into a condition that is likely to ruin their programs (66 years to come.
