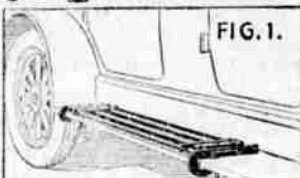


FIG. 1.—Showing Superior Luggage Carrier clamped on the running board, in folded position. Does not have to be removed from car when not in use.

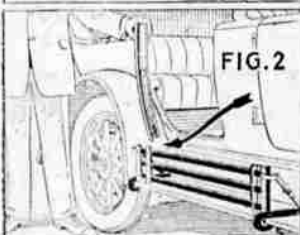


FIG. 2.—Showing Superior Luggage Carrier opened to 9 inches in height. At this height the car doors can be opened over the carrier, leaving access to the car. Adjustable from 34 inches to 60 inches in length.

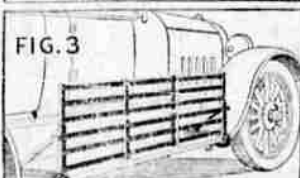


FIG. 3.—Showing Superior Luggage Carrier opened to 16 inches in height; adjustable from 34 inches to 60 inches in length.

### A NOURISHING LIMA BEAN LOAF

Spring brings with it the opportunity for the housewife to exercise her ingenuity in providing her household with vegetable substitutes for the ordinary meat dishes. Here, for example, is a lima bean loaf. Use one cup of dried lima beans. Put to soak overnight. In the morning drain and cook in boiling water slowly until the beans are tender, but have not lost their shape. Drain them in an enameled ware colander. Melt two and one-half tablespoons of butter, and into that stir two and one-half cups of bread crumbs. The crumbs should be taken from the soft part of the bread, not from the crust. Add one tablespoonful of chopped parsley and one-quarter of a tablespoonful of powdered sage; also one and one-quarter teaspoons of salt. Beat three eggs and mix with the beans. Stir in the bread crumb mixture. Have ready an enameled ware breadpan well buttered. This will turn out quite solid and can be sliced as one would a loaf.

Commercial News in American Papers. Printed by Britisher LONDON. (AP)—American and her newspapers were cited as an example to England by L. S. Amery, former Lord of the Admiralty, in a speech at a recent luncheon of the London district journalists. Mr. Amery said he was much struck by the trade statistics which appeared in American newspapers, compared with anything published here either about this country or the British Empire.

The prosperity of America, the speaker said, had been due to the fact that the whole of the people, with its press behind them, had thought for two generations in terms of development and not in terms of individual trading or business in the ordinary sense of the word.

## MANY WOMEN NOW IN CLUBS

Club Members Report a Host of New Members During the Last Few Years.

LOS ANGELES. (AP)—In the last four years the General Federation of Women's clubs has added to its rolls more than 3,000 new clubs, raising the list of member clubs from 2,000 to about 5,000 and the number of affiliated club-women to more than 1,000,000, the president, Mrs. Thomas G. Winter, of Minneapolis, reported at the opening business session of the federation's seventeenth biennial convention here today.

Besides the addition in memberships and affiliations, some of the outstanding accomplishments of the last four years, since the federation met in Des Moines, Ia., were outlined by Mrs. Winter as follows:

"The purchase and equipping of headquarters in Washington. "The movement toward universal membership, made actual in 14 states. "Junior membership organization and club institutes.

"The closer relation of state officers to each other and to the General Federation." "Every year, with our growth in numbers," added the president, "with our awakening and greater civic consciousness, the demands upon us grow. Possibilities loom upon us suddenly for great accomplishments, and if we hesitate or turn away, they seek other agencies and warmer hearts."

Paralleling certain changes and movements within the organization, Mrs. Winter explained, "must be added two very important developments for linking up the new and old and pouring fresh currents of life into our veins: first, insuring the continuity of our efforts by getting more and more young people into our organization, which resulted in creating the committee on junior membership; second, the equally important right about face in our attitude toward our jobs that has lifted them out of the amateur stage and made us realize that club work is not a catch-can affair, nor to be administered by rule of thumb, but that we needed to school ourselves in the best ways of doing the work to make ourselves efficient. This meant the training school of the club institute."

The administration of Mrs. Winter served from 1920 to 1924. The new national officers, to be elected at the present convention, will fill a term of two years.

Frozen Chicken for Soldiers. MANHATTAN. (AP)—Frozen chicken is to be served to all American soldiers stationed in Manila and Camp Nichols in lieu of 60 percent of the beef component, until the supply of chickens is exhausted. The commissary recently became overstocked with chickens.

## How New Federal Tax Law Affects Each One

How the new federal tax law will affect the people is now a subject of much interest. One of the most interesting tables on the subject has been prepared by Senator Simmons, Democrat, who is credited with authorship of the law in its principal features. The table applies to future tax payments, there being a flat reduction of 15 per cent on taxes being paid this year.

The normal rate of taxes on incomes will be 2 per cent on the first \$4,000 of income, 4 per cent on incomes from \$4,000 to \$5,000 and 6 per cent on incomes above \$5,000.

The surtax rates begin at 1 per cent on incomes in excess of \$10,000 and run up to 40 per cent on incomes of more than \$500,000. Senator Simmons, author of the income tax law, has prepared this table showing the amount of combined normal and surtaxes paid by a married man with no dependents as compared with the present law.

## NEW FACTORY OPENS SOON

Coca Cola Franchise for Union and Wallowa Counties Secured by Proprietors.

Machinery is being installed in the new Harvey Green and Hoss bottling works on East Adams avenue and the plant will be under operation in a few days.

All equipment is of the most modern design and the plant has a capacity of 200 cases of beverages a day. Several newer developments in the manufacture of soft drinks have been utilized by the proprietors, among them an automatic labelling machine which labels several hundred bottles an hour.

Nearly every variety of soft drink will be turned out by the new plant, according to the proprietors. The company has the Coca Cola manufacturing franchise for Union and Wallowa counties and the drink will be distributed from La Grande hereafter instead of being shipped in.

All machinery will be driven electrically and the plant will be

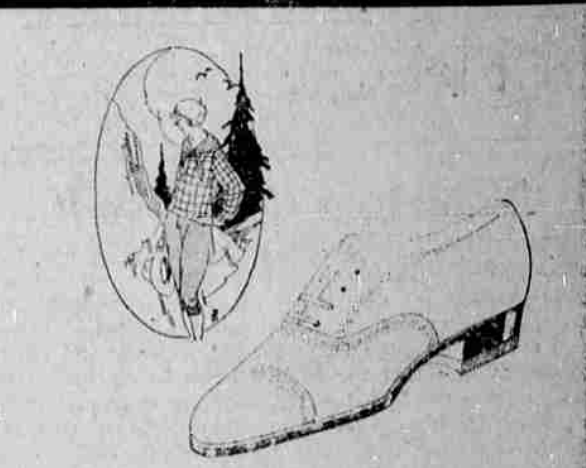
