Johnson Wins Seat - CLEVELAND, O. (By the Associated Press) - A letter from the grave suddenly upset the plans of republican party managers for 'cleaning up' the long standing national fight in Georgia and resulted Wednesday in the seating again of delegates headed by Harry Lincoln Johnson, the negro national committeeman from that state, long a strong rival before the national convention.

those who favor our case will organize the same at the ballot box and elect the prohibition party's candidate. America will have a sure enough regime of law enforcement that will show everybody that 'prohibition will prohibit.' 'Constitutional prohibition under the late lamented President Wilson was openly flouted and the non-enforcement thereof became an open scandal,' Mr. Paris said.

'It was only upon the insistence of the people and tremendous pressure brought to bear upon congress that Mr. Wilson's efforts to strike off the day of prohibition were defeated.'

'Again, under the more recent lamented President Harding, the man who had made millions as a distiller was made secretary of the treasury and responsible head over all for the enforcement of the prohibition law. Do you wonder that with Mellon as secretary of the treasury and head of the prohibition unit, the distillers where he made his money is still operating, and by all reports, never had closed since we have had prohibition, and that whiskey valued at thousands of dollars, has been removed therefrom and furnished to bootleggers.'

Haps, President - 'In the present administration, why is it that almost simultaneously with the president's joining the church he pardons one of the worst bootleggers in all America, after he had been convicted? Is it not because the liquor traffic costs us a unit, while the church divides it?'

'If a certain famous - perhaps I might say infamous - president of one of the large universities of this country has his way about the matter of platform to be issued by the republican party, and gets a plank declaring for modification of the Volstead act, some highly exalted people are going to find themselves out of a political home.'

No definite planks were suggested with the exception that he said 'he was agreed with a noted federal judge who said the Volstead act should be amended so that the former planks who violate that law shall forfeit their citizenship and become automatically subjects for deportation.'

'Is it not a very great wonder that we have the present marvelous, beneficial results of prohibition, when the law is in the hands of its enemies for enforcement?'

The late lamented war-time president, although himself a Prohibitionist, either issued while governor of New Jersey an address that was so favorable to the liquor traffic that the breweries had it broadcast over the nation when your speaker called him down on the proposition, the strongest response that could be obtained was said to have been on used by the brewers. When I asked that he disown all intention of aiding the breweries, he shut up like a clam.

'If you want law respected, obeyed and enforced, then you should cast your ballot for that one and only party which has ever stood for law and order. Do that and I promise you that in the ensuing quadrennium you will see the liquor traffic killed and not even its ghost shall arise to give you trouble.'
