PROHI PARTY NAMES TICKET

Missouri Banker and California Woman Selected; Evangelist Thrown Out.

COLUMBUS, O. (By the Associated Press)—The Prohibition party adopted its platform and nominated a national ticket Friday after a session which was marked by the withdrawal of several delegates from the floor and a stinging rebuke to A. P. Gauthey, Seattle, Wash., evangelist, first nominated for the vice presidency and then thrown off the ticket. The nominees were:

For president—H. P. Paris, Clinton, Mo., banker.

For vice president—Miss Marie C. Brehm, a temperance worker of Long Beach, Cal.

Miss Brehm was nominated by acclamation after Dr. Gauthey had won the place by a vote of 3 to 1 over her and Col. Alfred L. Mouldy, Waterloo, Ind.

(Continued from page 1) to harvest at least half a normal crop of winter wheat. Others in the vicinity are even more hopeful and a general economic improvement throughout the section is anticipated.

The spring wheat and other crops are expected to be correspondingly benefited by the rain.

Helps Fruitmen.

Karl Stackland of Cove, one of the leading cherry producers of the valley, stated that the fruit growers would derive much good from the precipitation.

In regard to the lightening of the water situation Frank Hayes, city manager, stated this morning that the rain would be indirectly of help to the community by storing up moisture, which could be used later on. The Beaver Creek reservoir is at present full of water. When asked whether the additional snowfall in the mountains would be of benefit in keeping the reservoir full Mr. Hayes said that he thought that there would be no shortage of water at Beaver creek but that the chief difficulty lay in bringing the water to the city as rapidly as it is used during hot weather.
