RULES AND REGULATIONS UNION COUNTY BANKERS ASSOCIATION

In view of the conditions brought about with in the past few years on account of the increased cost of paper, printing of checks, check books, East books and other materials used in connection with the operation of checking accounts, and the cost to the bank in handling a checking account carrying an average balance of less than \$50.00, being considerably in excess of any profit that can be derived from this account, it has become necessary that the banks throughout the county adopt a more conservative and business like method in order to avoid loss in serving small depositors. The following rules have been mutually adopted by the banks of Union County to take effect June 1st, 1924. Similar regulations have been in effect in all the larger banks of the country for years, and are now being put into effect by most of the county organizations in this state. This is being done at the urgent suggestion of representatives of the Treasury Department as well as the Oregon State Bankers Association. The charges made effective at this time are for the sole purpose of defraying the actual expense of rendering the service to the customer which they have a right to expect. 1. A Minimum Charge of 50 cents will be made on all loans. 2. The cost of extra printing on all checks for business or personal

POLICE QUILTS BY REQUEST

North Powder Marshal Fails to Make Arrest; Successor Not Named Yet.

NORTH POWDER (Special to the Observer)—Because Marshal John West failed to make an arrest Thursday, after a description was given him of an alleged auto thief, he was asked to resign, and he complied with the request, states a local newspaper.

A confusion by auto numbers was given as the reason for failure to arrest the man. A Haines officer telephoned here to be on the lookout for a man driving a Buick car, said to be stolen property, and further alleging the car was to be drunk. The car came through this city, slowed down, but Mr. West becoming confused, and thinking the car had a different number than the one he was looking for, let it go by without investigation.

PRINCE BORROWS TWO DOLLARS TO PAY FOR LICENSE

NEW YORK (AP)—Prince Vignog of Denmark arrived on the 15-ton ship, and with a \$2 greenback borrowed from his fiancée, Miss Eleanor Margaret Green of New York city, purchased a license to marry her.

The prince was accompanied by his father, Prince Valdemar. They were met at the Estonia's pier in Brooklyn by Miss Green and Charles B. Alexander, former president of the National Democratic club. A police motorcycle squad escorted the party directly to the marriage license bureau at city hall.

All went well until City Clerk Cruise, ready to protest the license, said "Two dollars, please." Prince Vignog handed a hundred of Danish coins; Mr. Cruise shook his head, a royal flush overcame the princely countenance, while Miss Green drew a fresh \$2 bill from her handbag and said "Here it is."

The prince immediately repaid the loan with a bit of yellow paper which he said was worth only \$2 in Copenhagen. His father gravely acquiesced in the transaction.
