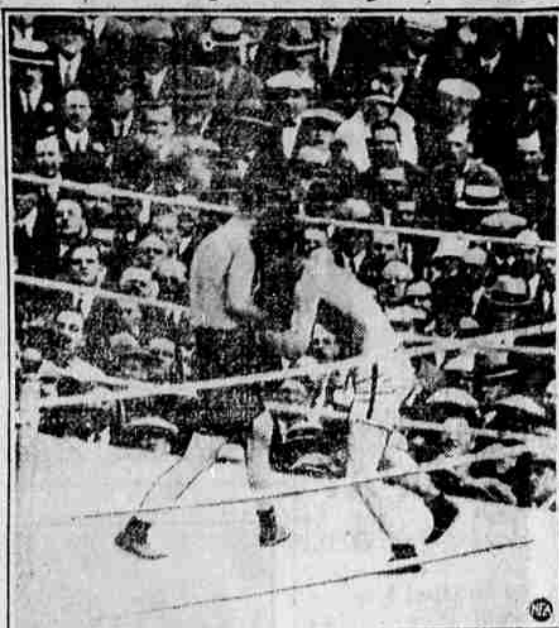
BOISE WINS AGAIN

Kill a Crow or Pay a Fine Is Constantinople Ordinance

CONSTANTINOPLE, (AP)—To relieve the city and its suburbs of a destructive plague of crows the authorities are issuing free powder and shot, and every male citizen is required to present at least one dead crow to the nearest police station or pay a fine of 125 piastres.
Always present in large numbers this year these crows, or more precisely, rooks, have become a pest and have done much damage. They have ravaged the truck gardens around the city and on the Prinkipo Islands, those beautiful resorts in the Sea of Marmora, they have caused a water famine. The water supply of the islands is safe from crows and the birds have so fouled the roofs as to make the water unpotable.

Umpqua Timber Blaze.
ROSBURG, Ore.—All strategic points in the national forest and the privately-owned timber lands have been manned by lookouts and fire-fighting crews, it was announced. Several small fires have been reported but all were under control. One fire has been burning in the Diamond lake region but was under control. All crows are in the field 20 days earlier than usual.
Only one fire was burning in the government timber, it was reported today from the headquarters of the Umpqua national forest. The fire was under control and a small crew was guarding it to prevent any further spread. The Douglas county patrol reported six small fires, mostly range fires set to burn off undergrowth. All of these were under control.

Moro Pearl Divers Flock To New South Sea Fields

MANILA, (AP)—New and extensive pearl beds have been discovered by Moro fishermen recently in the China Sea off the north coast of the Philippine group, according to Dr. W. H. Wade, chief pathologist of the Cullion leper colony, who has just returned to Manila.
Moro fishermen have a monopoly of the new beds, and the waters around the coast of Palawan are dotted with the sails of their boats. Until recently the chief pearl beds of that region were located south of Palawan in the Sulu Sea and a majority of the fishermen were Japanese.

GUANAJUATO, Mexico (AP)—Despite his advanced age, Father Jose Guadalupe Cantreut continued serving his flock almost to the day of his death, which occurred after he had passed his 110th birthday. He is believed to have been one of the oldest residents of Mexico whose birth record could be established beyond a doubt.

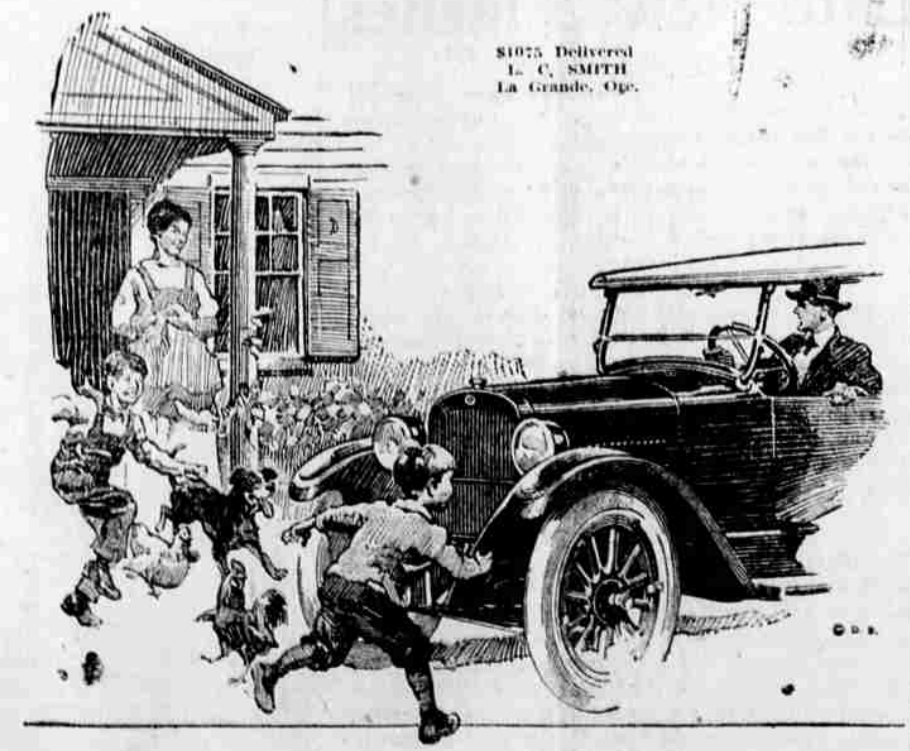
