

CONGRESS END SATURDAY EVE

Legislators Fail to Pass
Many Important Bills;
Money for Bonus in
Doubt.

WASHINGTON (By the Associated Press).—Congress ended its six months session Saturday night in an atmosphere of controversy which has marked its proceedings from the start. Western senators in the final hours of the session fought and lost a desperate fight for relief for the farmer and the reclamation policies of the government.

authorizing the construction of new crumbers and modern buildings and the deficiency appropriation bill carrying funds to be used for the operation of the bonus law and bills for many other purposes, failed in the final hour of legislation when the session ended at 7 p. m.

Not only did the deficiency bill go down into defeat in the race against time but the special effort in the last minutes in the house to make the bonus appropriation was lost in the senate.

Republican leaders in the senate declared that only a special session of congress could provide the necessary funds for the bonus and other measures.

The deficiency appropriation bill was blocked in the senate by Senator Pittman, democrat, Nevada, because of the omission of reclamation appropriation proposed by him.

The house cleared up many minor bills but spent most of the day quarrelling over reclamation legislation which had been attached by the senate to the deficiency bill. The principal features of the administration reclamation plan were acceptable but in others senators would not agree.

Among the chief measures over the unusual painful demise of the session was the Senate Daughters committee whose plan to reimburse women went down because Senator Brookhart failed to obtain the opportunity to call up resolutions for that purpose.

DALLAS CHOSEN FOR CONVENTION CITY NEXT YEAR

THE DALLAS, Ore. (AP).—With the selection of Dallas as the 1925 convention city, the annual convention of the Oregon state grange closed here. Governor Pierce was the principal speaker at the closing session, speaking in favor of the state income tax and declaring the tax had brought in thus far this year over \$700,000 at a total cost of collection expenses of \$20,000.

Officers for the coming year were installed. George Palmeter again taking the chair of state grange master. The convention closed with an executive session.

Freewater Postmaster Favored
WASHINGTON, D. C., June 8. (AP).—Hardesty, present postmaster at Freewater, Ore., is expected to continue in office for another four years, his name having been sent to the president for reappointment. The president also has before him the names of Mrs. Lella Phelps for postmaster at Hermiston, Ore., and William E. Reed for postmaster at Mitchell. James W. Dunn has been certified by the civil service commission as the only eligible for appointment as postmaster at Saint Benedict, Ore. The office pays an annual salary of \$2500.

To Write Shoemakers' Lexicon.
LONDON (AP).—Ernfried Jaffert, a Stockholm shoemaker, is now in London to complete a dictionary of technical terms in the leather and footwear industry. He has been awarded a cash prize for the purpose by a Swedish foundation as a contribution to the cost of a trip abroad for the purpose, and will shortly go to the United States. Jaffert is especially interested in orthopedic shoemaking and already has enriched the Swedish section of his dictionary with 2400 words.

RETAIL SALES AT HIGH MARK

A new high-water mark in Overland and Willys-Knight retail sales was reached last week when a total of 7,254 retail sales certificates were received at the Willys-Overland factory, exceeding the record of 5,724 certificates set a year ago, according to an announcement made by Gettings & Hanks, La Grande dealers.

This is the greatest number of certificates returned from the dealer organizations within one week in the history of the company. Record of these certificates is maintained by the company as an accurate picture of retail sales conditions in dealers' territories, showing at all times how and where car stocks are moving.

Improved weather conditions account largely for this remarkable spirit, although a large share of this total also has been attributed to the buying interest aroused by the announcement of the new Overland Blue Bird model.

Such a responsive chord did this new and attractive car strike in the motoring public's fancy that added orders from the dealers caused the factory to increase its original planned production of these cars by 25 per cent.

Interest in the Blue Bird in Chicago resulted in unprecedented delivery of 175 Overlands and 117 Willys-Knights during the first 14 days of May, with unfilled orders on hand for 100 additional Willys-Knights and 162 Overlands. One city dealer alone reported the sale of 18 new cars and two used cars in one day.

At Huntington, W. V., Blue Bird announcement is held directly responsible for the sale of 25 Overland and Willys-Knight cars, six of them Blue Birds. At Norfolk, Va., the dealer's entire stock was cleaned out in addition to which he wrote seven orders for other Willys-Overland models.

Down in Miami, Florida, on the day of the Blue Bird announcement the dealer sold eight Blue Birds, which is similar to the story telegraphed from Dallas, Texas, where unbounded enthusiasm has greeted the newest addition to the Willys-Overland family.

Many Roses Yield But One Ounce of Attar

KANZANLIK, Bulgaria (AP).—The rose harvest of this region, known as the "Valley of Roses," and which produces most of the world's supply of oil, or attar of roses, is now in full swing.

The harvest continues until about mid-June and it is believed this year's crop will be a good one although the production has been somewhat decreased by the incursions of tobacco cultivation.

Statistics just issued on the production and sale of oil of roses indicate that the United States is now the second primary producing country of the world, ranking next to France.

Last year the French took about one-half of the product of the "Valley of Roses," the districts of Kozanlik and Karlovo lying between Stara Planina and the Rila mountains. Oil of roses is the base of nearly all perfumery. The industry in Bulgaria is practically in the hands of small proprietors, peasants working on a cooperative basis.

The reason for the high cost of rose oil is found in the fact that in 1923 only about 470 ounces were produced from 11,000,000 pounds of bloom.

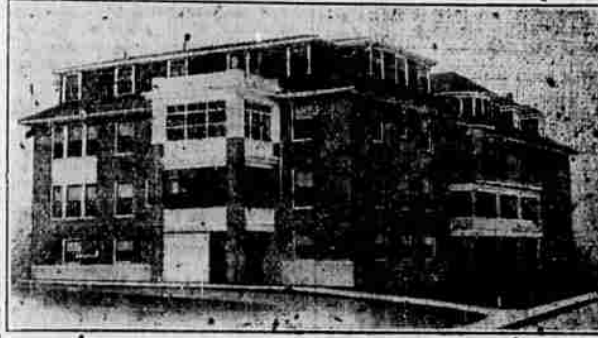
