## PREPARING TO REFUND MONEY

### Clyde G. Huntley Busy Now Making Ready the One - Fourth Income Tax Refunds.

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—Upon being officially advised from Washington that the task of refunding to taxpayers who paid their federal income tax in full at the time of filing their returns last March an amount equal to one-fourth of the tax paid will be performed by the local revenue office, Clyde G. Huntley, collector of internal revenue, today began the preliminary work of handling these refunds. "It will be a big job for Collector Huntley's office, since approximately 24,000 taxpayers who liquidated their tax in full in March will receive refunds, the task is further compounded inasmuch as 25 per cent of the tax reported by some 14,000 other taxpayers who paid their tax in part at the time of filing their returns will be refunded and this also involves a great deal of clerical work and bookkeeping.

"In all cases where taxpayers paid the full amount of their tax shown on their returns, refunds will be made of one-fourth of the amounts," said Mr. Huntley today. "It will not be necessary for the taxpayer to file a claim or take any initiative action. In fact, correspondence from taxpayers relative to such refunds will serve to slow down the work of listing all of the items and sending the necessary schedules to Washington in order that the checks may be drawn.

"Taxpayers are urged to be patient for several weeks will be required before the task of making these refunds can be completed. I wish to assure the public that this work will be carried on just as rapidly as it can be performed by the employees of my office. Interested taxpayers can best speed the work of making these adjustments if they will refrain from taking up their individual cases by correspondence with my office."
