PIRATES DOWN VISITING TEAM

Baker Allows Six Runs in First Inning, Giving Game to La Grande 7 to 2.

He struck out Keene singled and out, up for the second time in one inning, shifted, ending the inning. Six runs for La Grande, five hits and three errors against Baker.

Baker Scores Twice

In Baker's hit of the first two, with two down, brought one run in due to two hits and an error. He singled, went to second and third on Clifford's error, and came home when Arnold singled. Tuma grounded out.

Baker ended their scoring in the second when Bates singled, went to second, gained third on a passed ball and came home on Harrington's single. In that inning Theison saved another run when he faultlessly handled a liner down the left foot line that would have ordinarily been good for 3 bases. As it was he held Cassidy to a single. Keene struck out two straight in the second, duplicating a similar feat in the first, and the other out came when infield playing caught Cassidy between third and home. Helms threw to Peterson after Cassidy started home, and Peterson snapped a back to Knight who tagged the Bakerite out.

From the second on, Baker went scoreless and only reached third once.

Two Doubles Made

Baker has been specializing in double-plays all during the season and exhibited two here yesterday. In the second and third two neat ones were completed. Fosbury to Harrington to Woolums and Cassidy to Harrington to Woolums, respectively.

On the whole the Baker infield played snappy ball after the first inning and the visiting gardeners performed excellently as well. Arnold, behind the bat, didn't do so well, however, contributing two

errors and also giving the spectators a royal opportunity to pounce on him when he dropped the umpire's decision on a third strike in the fifth.

Keene's Pitching O. K.

Spec Keene, who hasn't been pitching very often this year, did well in his debut for the Pirates. He struck out 12 Baker men, allowed seven hits—scattered, and but one earned run. Keene was a little wild in the first two innings but he settled down and during the last six, the best batters could do was three isolated singles.

Fosbury also had the Pirates eating out of his hand during the last eight innings after he pitched back to earth.

Helms was the hitting star for the Pirates yesterday, getting a single and a double in four times at bat, scoring one run and bringing in one man. Arnold and Bates each got two hits in four times at bat.

A fair crowd was in attendance.

Sunday, however, the Pirates face a tough team from Washington—Pasco. Pasco, due to leniency at the hands of the Blue Mountain league officials, has strengthened up with three new players, according to reports, and they are coming here hoping to drop the Swabshucklers in four or five of blood.
