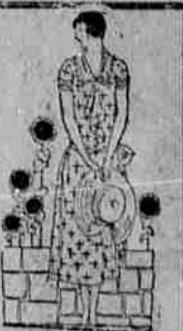
Blazing a New Trail In Tense Western Dramas.
 Are there still new trails to be blazed in the western photodrama?
 William S. Hart says there are. In an interview he states he believes there is a rich vein of western romances which has been untouched a vein of glittering wealth which will open a virgin field of drama. He says:
 "The popular conception of a western picture is one in which the chief element of thrill is hard riding, expert roping and flaming gun-play. These things all have their places but there is a deeper wealth of drama that is less generally known. The cowboy of the ranges will always be popular, and rightly, for he makes romantic figures. But back beyond the ranges, in the mountains there is another type of westerner, a type that lives today.
 "It is this type that I want to bring to the public in my new pictures, 'Singer Jim McKee.' I want to show that the romance and drama of the old west has not passed with the coming of fences and irrigation ditches to the ranges. I want to show that back in the mountains there remains a west that reflects all the color of the old frontier, perhaps less gun-play and surface glamour, but nonetheless a west of romance, with drama, where thrilling things may happen.
 "I portray the modern westerner, who still lives in the wide open spaces and moves in an element of romance."
Hutchison One of Few Authors Able To Direct Picture.
 Prospective writers of photoplays who have been hearing the complaints of authors who find fault with the screen adaptations of their stories should find particular interest in the photoplay made from A. S. M. Hutchison's best-seller, "This Freedom." This is one of the few photoplays ever produced which bears the unqualified approval of the author. Another unusual fact about this production is that the titles were written by the author before the actual work in filming the picture was started.
