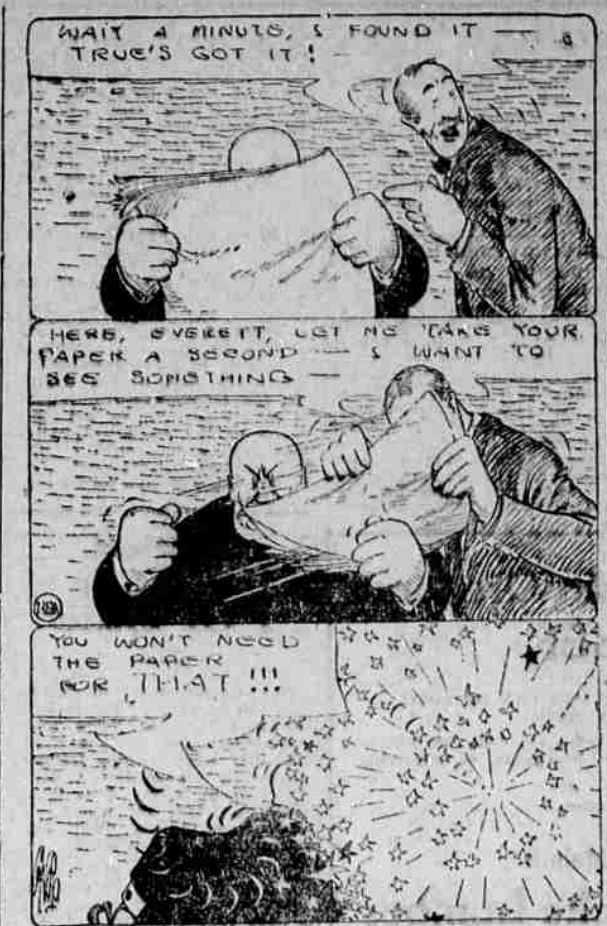

SIX BOND ISSUES FACED

EUGENE, Ore.—An ordinance providing for special election to be held in Eugene July 2 to vote upon six bond issues was passed by the city council at an adjourned session of judges and clerks of the election were appointed.

The bond measures to be voted upon are as follows: A \$500,000 issue to erect a municipal auditorium; \$50,000 for reconstruction of a sewer system; \$50,000 to pay for the city's share of the cost of public rest room; \$50,000 for the remodeling of the city hall; \$25,000 for new fire-fighting apparatus; and \$10,000 bonds for a new concrete city jail.

Low Water Talks Salmon

GRANTS PASS, Ore.—According to fishermen who have just returned from a trip to Hamey falls, about eight miles below Alameda, salmon and steelheads are plentiful from ascending the river by the lack of water. The falls are 11 feet high and very few of the fish are successful in finding the one place where they can go over. Fishermen plan to blast away a part of the falls if permission can be obtained.
