**Notice of Hearing on Proposed Street Improvement.**

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that the Commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, and Intends to improve Improvement District No. 146 in the City of La Grande, Oregon, in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore adopted by the Commission, and that the report of the commission estimates for said improvement is now on file in the office of the Recorder of the City of La Grande, Oregon; that the said Commission has set Wednesday the 9th day of July, 1924, at 7:30 o'clock p. m. of said day, at the Commission Room in the City Building in La Grande, Oregon, as the time and place when and where said Commission will meet and hear and determine all objections, remonstrances and appeals of any persons against said improvement and the proposed assessment thereon, and for the purpose of receiving testimony for and against the property to be benefited thereby in said district.

That the boundaries of the district to be improved and benefited by the said proposed improvement as finally adopted by the Commission areas follows, to-wit: Beginning at the center of the intersection of Fourth Street and "K" Avenue in the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon; thence south along center line of Fourth Street one hundred sixty (160) feet; thence west along a line one hundred sixty (160) feet from and parallel to the center line of "K" Avenue a distance of two hundred ten (120) feet to corner of Block 35, Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon; thence north along a line one hundred fifty (150) feet from and parallel to the center line of First Street to the center of "M" Avenue; thence east along the center line of "M" Avenue six hundred thirty (630) feet, thence south along a line one hundred sixty (160) feet from and parallel to the center line of Second Street four hundred eighty (480) feet to center of the alley in Block 32, Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon; thence east along a line one hundred sixty (160) feet from and parallel to the center line of "K" Avenue five hundred eighty (580) feet to the center of Fourth Street; thence south along center line of Fourth Street one hundred sixty (160) feet to point of beginning all located in Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon.

That said Improvement District No. 146, is hereby created by the Commission of the City of La Grande, for the purpose of improving and with the intention to improve said improvement district by grading the following named streets to the proper subgrade between curb and line: "K" Avenue from west line of Fourth Street to west line of First Street and including two full street intersections and three-fourths of one intersection; Second Street from north line of "K" Avenue to south line of "M" Avenue and including three-fourths of a street intersection; First Street from north line of "K" Avenue to south line of "M" Avenue including one full street intersection, and by constructing therein hard surface pavement thirty (30) feet in width between curb lines and including the street intersections as above named, also alley intersections, also by constructing combination curb and gutter where not in place, concrete sidewalks where not in place, catch basins, etc., all on the above named streets located in Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, the cost of above named improvements are to be assessed to the property especially benefited thereby.

### DAWES GIVEN BIG WELCOME

Reaches Chicago Today An Hour Ahead of Reception Committee's Expectations.

CHICAGO. (By the Associated Press)—General Charles G. Dawes slipped into Chicago an hour before the reception committee expected him and went direct to his bank, the Central Trust company, where he received an enthusiastic ovation from crowds gathered. Dawes declined to talk of his nomination as vice president by the Republicans, and followed by as many of a throng as could force themselves into the bank lobby, returned to his private office and, with his pipe in hand, began opening mail and telegrams piled high over his desk.

250 pages of printed text, which set forth the allegations that Coppee kept his furnaces and rosters working full time during the war, and that he delivered bombs, coal tar and oils to the Germans by thousands of tons; and that he acted freely, voluntarily and knowingly, in delivering these materials to the Germans the state claims he furnished war materials to the enemy.

In keeping his forces at work in this way, the state claims he virtually furnished men to the enemy. The benzol Coppee is alleged to have delivered to the Germans could be used not only for the manufacture of asphyxiating gas but also for the manufacture of shells used against the allies.

The state admits that the Germans could have requisitioned the materials manufactured by Coppee, but alleges that he intended his production, perfected his methods and increased his plant.

Not only does the state charge that the Coppee deliveries were used in making poison gases and planes and submarines. Thus, it claims, the Germans saw their military power increase by reason of Belgian benzols.

Coppee has already indicated part of his defense: First, that the Germans were all powerful in Belgium and could requisition anything they pleased, enforcing its delivery.

Second, that deliveries he made were supposed to remain in Belgium for the benefit of Belgians.

Third, that Count de Brocqueville, who was Belgian prime minister at the time, authorized him to trade with the Germans, as Belgian population could not be allowed to die for want of work.
