AMERICA SENDS STAR ATHLETES

NEW YORK (By the Associated Press)—A modern argosy bearing a Jaxonian host in quest of the golden fleece of international athletic triumph, will set sail Monday when the main body of America's Olympic team departs for Paris and the 1924 world's championships, headed by a track and field array of 102 stars, a total aggregation of 253 men and women athletes who will carry the Yankee colors in eight different branches of competition will embark from Hoboken

on the specially chartered steamer America. The departure is scheduled to take place at noon, eastern standard time, to the accompaniment of a fitting patriotic farewell demonstration.

In addition to the track team, the expedition will include, according to official announcements Sunday night, 11 gymnasts, 24 boxers, 12 wrestlers, 38 men and women swimmers, 7 cyclists, 17 fencers and 19 equestrians. The Yale varsity eight, which won the right to represent the United States in the Olympics by a record-breaking victory in the final trials at Philadelphia Saturday, is scheduled to leave on the Homeric next Sunday, the day after the blue coat, attempting one of the most unusual campaigns in the aquatic annals, rows its annual four-mile race with Harvard at New London, Conn.

U.S. Hopes High. Seldom in the nearly 30 years of Olympic history has the United

States assembled so formidable a collection of stars in defense of the laurels this country has carried off consistently since the first games at Athens in 1896. Particularly is this true of the track and field squad, which in spite of the fact that it faces probably the stiffest competition of all time, will sail with high hopes of triumph as a result of the spectacular showing made in the final tryouts at the Harvard stadium.

No more sustained brilliancy has ever been witnessed in a track meet than that displayed in the two tests at Cambridge. Though veterans had their share of the limelight, the vast majority of the team that emerged from the trials is composed of new Olympic heroes, school and college stars, upon whose youthful shoulders the brunt of the international battle will rest. Only a score of those picked for the team were competitors of the 1920 Olympics at Antwerp, but the sensational fashion in

which newcomers met the acid tests convinced observers that America is prepared for the crucial fight as she seldom has been before.

Finland the little country whose athletes tied the United States in that first place honors with nine victories four years ago, will lead the rival charge at Paris, but predictions were made Sunday that Uncle Sam has at least a dozen potential Olympic champions in the array that embarks Monday.

Riders of the Pony Express

Honored by Bronze Tablet SALT LAKE CITY (AP)—A bronze tablet commemorating the site of a pony express station, and the fearless riders who made their way on horseback through the west in 1860-61 with government mails, has been placed on the Salt Lake Tribune building in the center of the business district here. It is the first of a series of tablets which will be placed on the site of other pony express stations.
