CORSETS MUST GO, DECALURES FASHION CREATORS AT PARIS

PARIS (AP)—The death blow of the corset is claimed to have been dealt by a small group of Paris style creators who boast dictation of the fashion of the world. They say the corset is doomed to share the fate of the hoop skirt and bustle.

The new silhouette which will appear during the Grand Prix this month, according to the style dictators, will make it absolutely impossible to wear corsets. The latest garments are described as clinging naturally to the form, avoiding any unnecessary fullness around the hips. The style dictators ruling, combined with worldwide propaganda for women's styles generally, pointed to as responsible for placing the corset on the defensive for the 1924 season.

Art Collection of Hungarian Noble to Be Sold at Auction

PRAGUE (AP)—A part of the famous art collection of the Hungarian magnate, Count Palffy, who died in 1908, will be sold at auction this summer. The treasures which are stored in the four Palffy castles are valued at \$2,000,000.

Among the articles to be put on sale in June are Napoleon's bed, the furnishings of Marie Theresa's drawing room, two Rubens, a series of old Dutch masters and the famous "Head of Christ" by Goltzke Rent.

The second sale will occur in the autumn and will consist largely of porcelain.

Treasures of Humble Plants Unlocked by Negro Scientist

TUSKIGEE, Ala. (AP)—With magic touch Dr. George W. Carter, negro scientist who for the past 20 years has been a member of the faculty of the Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute here, has opened a treasure trove of nature's hidden perfections.

Concealed under the guise of a sweet potato, a peanut and a pecan, nature has hidden a myriad of useful products, and these have been disclosed by Dr. Carter, who was born in a slave home on a Missouri farm.

The record of this scientist today stands: More than 100 commercial products from the sweet potato, 200 from the peanut, and more than 60 from the pecan.

Not stopping with that, Dr. Carter has transformed a lump of southern clay into beautiful colors, one of which is the Egyptian blue, the secret of which was believed to have died and been lost to the world with the ancients of the Nile valley.

This worker with the soil also has been given a Fellowship in the Royal Society of Great Britain and in 1923 was awarded the Spingard medal which each year is given to the man or woman of African descent and American citizenship who shall have made the highest achievement in any field of human endeavor.

The keynote for the occasion, Peoble, broken, Wilson leaned heavily on his cane as he addressed the crowd that made pilgrimage to his home on that anniversary of the end of the war, but as he spoke something of his old fighting spirit came back to him and as he closed his voice rose in a challenge to those foes, "those fools," who interposed their "puny wills" against a cause which, he said, "as certainly as there is a God in heaven will prevail."

With this last message from

their old commander as the battlers, champions of the league in the convention believe the ex-soldier spirit of the delegates may be roused to a higher pitch than by any other issue.

The leaders of the league cause say that it can be used in any way to the party's disadvantage in the campaign.

"The Republicans will charge us with favoring the league, whether we say so or not," they explain. "They will seek to use it against us, anyway. All we propose is to make the league battle an offensive not a defensive one; to stand definitely and boldly for American participation in the only world organization which promises any practicable assistance in maintaining the peace of the world."
