FIGHT IS WON

After five years of unending effort the American Legion has made the principle of adjusted compensation a fact. The fight has been won.

The credit belongs to no single man, to no single club, but to all the legion.

When the crisis came, when it looked as if justice were to be denied for another year, it was the legion as a whole that set in motion the forces which resulted in our success. Some months ago when it appeared that the legion voice was to go unheard in the report of Washington I appealed to the legion to make itself heard. No one man or small group of men could do it. The legion—you men at home—held the trump card—your voice. You responded as you responded in 1917. And your efforts brought success.

I congratulate you and am proud to be your leader. But the response you gave was to be expected from legionnaires. You did your loyal duty.

The Adjusted Compensation Bill is law. The legion put it over. So upon the legion devolves the stupendous task of administering the details which will result. We must handle the individual application of every veteran and see to it that he obtains his insurance certificate. Three million non-legion veterans will look to us to aid them, and to them we owe a duty. Therefore the American Legion has placed its organization at the disposal of the government. We must carry on for our non-legion buddies.

Every proof is told in this issue of the Weekly what it can do to help. I want each post to place itself in readiness to render this service for its members and all other veterans, to show by its action that our declaration that the legion is an institution of service is no idle remark.

Now that the heights is won I want to speak frankly to veterans whose opposition to adjusted compensation caused them to withdraw from the legion. Majority rule is the cornerstone of democracy. The majority of legionnaires voted for adjusted compensation and not it. Now that it is out of the way, the legion will carry on with its other endeavors—endeavors that make it the most powerful force for good in the nation. You must remember that after all, the Adjusted Compensation Bill can but one item in our program for organizing the country. There are still disabled buddies to guide and help, still children orphaned by the war to care for. There still remains our country to serve in time of peace. There is still your community to be aided through your individual post. Give us a helping shoulder at the wheel.

ANNOUNCEMENT

The Victory number of the American Legion Weekly in many respects the most important issue of this magazine ever published. It will vitally interest every world war veteran and every dependent of a deceased veteran who is eligible to the benefits of the newly enacted Federal Adjusted Compensation law will want copies of the Victory number.

The director of the Veterans' Bureau is the administrator of the compensation act. The administrator is charged, under the law, with the dissemination of complete information concerning the provisions of the act, with the distribution of the official application forms and instructions in accord with which they must be filled out, sworn to and forwarded to Washington. In Washington they are charged with the verification of all statements made in these forms and the payment of all approved claims.

Few appreciate the magnitude of this undertaking. A special corps of more than 4000 persons is being organized and trained to take care of the Washington end of it alone.

About five acres of floor space is being provided. The individual records of every veteran eligible against which the statements made on the applications must be checked, embrace 147,000,000 separate documents which must be kept ready for constant reference.

Legion Offered Services to U. S.

Before the Adjusted Compensation Bill became a law, the American Legion and the American Legion Weekly placed their services at the disposal of the government. This offer was accepted, contingent, of course, on the passage of the bill. Now the bill is to become a law, the legion organization, nationally and locally will participate officially in this stupendous administrative task in an effort to complete it in record time, thus rendering a service to all veterans and to the government.

Post to Distribute Application Blanks

Official application blanks, with directions for filling them out, will be distributed through all legion posts. Each post will have available without cost to the applicant a supply of forms sufficient for all veterans of the community. Post commanders and adjutants will be authorized to administer without charge the oath each applicant must take to the accuracy of the statements made in his application. Legion officials will act in this capacity as officers of the government. Their services will be available to all veterans, whether legion members or not.

HUGE FIND OF SAPPHIRES OPENED IN CEYLON

COLOMBO, Ceylon (AP)—The largest find of sapphires ever made in Ceylon, if not in the world, is reported from Palamadula, about 50 miles from Colombo. The find is in a patchy field of an area of about two acres.

The sapphires include yellow, gold, purple and blue stones varying in size from 20 to 700 carats. Some of them, the report states, weigh about half a pound and are marvelous in color. One of the best known Colombo dealers in precious stones declares the find an unprecedented one, but thinks the stones are too large. What

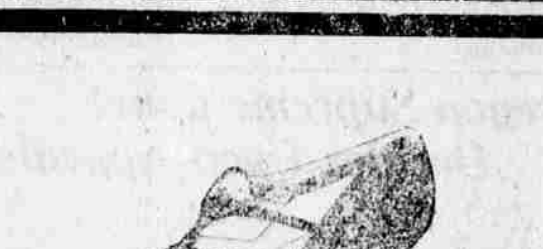
