MEMORIAL FOR CHIEF PLANNED

Harding Memorial Plan Is Reviewed in Article in Seattle Times.

WALLA WALLA, Wash. (Special)—Interest in the proposition of a Harding Memorial at Meacham, Oregon, in accordance with ideas advanced by S. A. Miller of Milton, Oregon, state representative, and A. P. Alexander of this city, a proposition that has been given considerable publicity in the press of this district, is now being recognized and assisted by the larger newspapers of the northwest.

In his talk regarding the movement, made before the Chamber of Commerce luncheon, Mr. Alexander called attention to this fact, citing a comprehensive news story which appeared in Sunday's issue of the Seattle Times under a two column heading.

The movement has also been given publicity in other larger northwestern newspapers and has been widely discussed by the people of this inter-mountain country, all of whom have shown interest in the evident possibilities for success, provided various organizations will take hold of the proposition and give it the required impetus to attract wider support and national recognition.

As the Seattle Times story well it is here reprinted in full. It reads as follows:

Plans for the erection of a memorial to President Harding atop the Blue Mountains at Meacham, Ore., are beginning to assume definite form with the announcement that a meeting will be held soon after August 1 to make definite plans for the memorial and designating the form it is to take and the spot at which it is to be erected.

For some time there has been a quiet campaign for the erection of this memorial on the spot where the late president delivered an address on July 2, 1923. The most talked of scheme presumes the building of a vista house to serve both as a memorial and as a resting place for travelers along the Oregon Trail. It is proposed that sufficient ground be obtained, at least a section of land, to allow the establishment of a permanent camping park, fitted with all conveniences, including a golf course, and that sufficient funds be raised to assure its perpetual maintenance.

Movement Gaining Ground. Those most prominently identified with the movement believe the erection of such a memorial with its additional attractive features as suggested would draw an unusually large number of people over the Oregon Trail each season. They point out the magnificence of the scenery and the possibility of obtaining a large tract of land in that region at a reasonable price, with the possibility that the government might be induced to set aside a tract of government land for the purpose.

The movement is gaining momentum daily in Walla Walla, Milton, Prosser, Pendleton, La Grande and Baker, and has attracted the attention of the governors of Washington and Oregon both of whom have expressed hearty accord with the plans already made. The organization meeting, which will be held at the McLoughlin high school in Milton, Ore., (point chosen because of its central location), will be presided over by Representative S. A. Miller of Milton as temporary chairman. The speakers will include Representative Sinnott of Oregon, Representative Summers of Washington, Mayor Hill of Walla Walla, Governor Pierce of Oregon, Governor Hart of Washington, and an invitation is to be extended to Marshall Dana of Portland, whose absorbing interest in the Oregon Trail has done much for that national highway.

Financing Scheme Proposed. Jefferson Myers, state treasurer of Oregon, has proposed a financing scheme that is being favorably considered. He suggests that an effort be made to have congress authorize the issuance of a sufficient amount of gold dollars which always find ready sale to collectors and can be readily sold at a premium, to cover the cost of construction, securing of site, etc., of the memorial. If necessary, he says, a quantity of half dollars also could be minted and sold at a premium. The severer course would carry the official Oregon Trail insignia on one side and the picture of President Harding on the other, with dates, etc., to explain the purpose of the issue. Gold dollars are a rarity and would probably be easy of disposal. The movement is strictly a non-partisan one. A. P. Alexander of Walla Walla, who has been busy for the last three months in awakening interest in the project, is a democrat of southern extraction. Mayor Hill of Walla Walla, candidate for governor on the democratic ticket, is one of its staunch supporters.

Oregon Governor to Aid. Governor Pierce of Oregon has signified his willingness to aid the movement in any way possible and has expressed himself as in thorough accord with the plan. Dozens of men and women of all political faiths, who have been interviewed on the subject, have expressed themselves in a like manner.

Physicians Oppose

Splitting of Fees

CHICAGO, (AP)—The secret division of fees by physicians, so-called "fee splitting," was condemned and recommendations made for the use of county societies in checking the practice, in the report of the judicial council of the American Medical Association, released today at the organization's convention.

Secretary Olin West reported more than 90,000 member physicians, 55,000 of whom are Fellows. He urged the carrying of post-graduate practical medical education to the individual member of the county medical society by the central organization. It also was brought out that today there is one physician for every 274 people in the United States.

The council on medical education and hospitals indicated that the number of medical schools in the United States now represents a normal supply and is sufficient to meet the demand for physicians.

"There are now 6,339 hospitals in the United States, 940 of which use interns," the council declared. "Only 650 of these 940 hospitals using interns have been approved by the council as proper for giving intern training. Many hospitals complain of a shortage of interns, and attempts are being made by the council to meet the shortage by lengthening the term of the internship, and by securing more equitable distribution."

Turkey Needs Women Doctors

CONSTANTINOPLE, (AP)—The great need in Turkey for female doctors, because male physicians are forbidden to attend orthodox Moslem women, has led Dr. George E. Vincent, director of the Rockefeller Foundation here, to consider the extension of the American training school for nurses and the American Medical College for Women.
