Hindu Bungalow Built In Hills of California for Picture.
Nestling in verdant hills of California is a charming bungalow wherein centers much of the drama in William Fox production of "The Shadow of the East," the E. M. It is adorned with wicker furniture and multi-colored cushions. There are lattice green shades, grass mats, grass lattice windows and red tile roof. The sides of the bungalow are of bamboo. In the front yard, rioting in rich flowers, were Annapurna roses, a fragrant flower that grows only in the high parts of India. It is a hardy rose, pink and white in color, but can not grow on sea level. These have withered. Pepper, fur, Himalayan cypress, bamboo, and tropical trees were plentiful in the setting. The peacocks tree has a white looking flower closely resembling that of the wild cherry. In this charming love home dwell Barry, played by Frank Mayo, and Lolaine, played by Evelyn Brent, his Hindu wife. Technical director, W. J. McGee, supervised the actual building of this building, which is accurate in every detail to that built in the hills of India.

Three German Executioners
Suicides in as Many Months
ERIKNER, Prussia, (AP)—Executioner Krautz who recently killed himself in this village, in the third executioner to meet death by guillotine in Germany within 2 months.
Krautz had cut off the heads of 125 prisoners, while Schwietz and Spatke, the two Breslau executioners who ended their own lives had carried out only 123 and 48 executions respectively.
In his last years Krautz wandered about the villages of Prussia, telling stories of the 125 persons he had put to death, and suffered many delusions. He slept with his executioner's axe at his head, and said he was unable to rest well without it.
Krautz regarded guillotining as an art and was always trying to perfect himself in its practice. Both he and Schwietz regarded Julius Dolber, the Prussian executioner, as the great master of their craft and exchanged letters with him.
British Emigrants Assured
Of Homes and Employment
LONDON, (AP)—It is reported that the cabinet has approved an extended scheme of migration from the British Isles to Australia. For some time Senator Wilson, representing the Australian Commonwealth government, has been in consultation with the Overseas Settlement committee in details of the scheme, which includes provision for a loan to Australia of about \$100,000,000 to assist the federal government in the carrying out of development work as a preliminary to the acceptance of immigrants.
