

COX'S NAME BEFORE MEET

NEW YORK (By the Associated Press).—Declaring that Governor James M. Cox of Ohio, "became a national figure at that moment in 1920 when only a few had the vision to see of the country to follow the new faith—the new political religion of Woodrow Wilson," Newton D. Baker, secretary of war in President Wilson's cabinet, Friday again placed Cox's name in nomination for the presidency before the Democratic national convention.

"Without hesitation or wavering, he fought the long 1920 campaign, fighting without doubt, appealing to our higher emotions, battling back the tide of the world, finally included us with the people of Europe as the children of despair," Mr. Baker told the convention.

"Since that campaign, his dedication to the cause has remained complete," Mr. Baker said. "He has devoted the intervening years to serious study in the old world and this. He has fought for these reasons, historic, traditional, permanent or temporary, which brought about our act of disengagement at the moment of our might. With pen and voice, with growing power of enthusiasm and knowledge, he has, as a private citizen, sought to inspire us to better and higher thinking and juster and more enduring policies. Thus Ohio feels that her son, once only her favorite, has become the nation's favorite."

"In her name, I present to you Ohio's three-time governor, her successful executive, her conservative leader, her son who has borne the banner of our principles bravely and blamelessly in a national contest, her man who has had the vision to see where America's opportunity now is and has the courage and the capacity to lead us to that realization."

"I present to you the name of James M. Cox."

"For three terms as her governor, this son of Ohio demonstrated his capacity as an executive. Without turmoil or confusion the business of a great state was dispatched. He was our war governor. Under his eager, patriotic leadership, the people of Ohio gave their quota in men and money to the national effort, and sustained the national cause with sacrificial fervor. The constitution of the state was renewed under his leadership, engrafting modern and liberal principles and political agencies in response to new conditions."

"A great body of wholesome legislation was enacted by his cooperation with legislators not always of his own political faith, until, in many of these new problems, which have come with increasing congestion and the development of an industrial society men search the Ohio statute books for the laws which he caused to be enacted as examples of sane solutions, which, in practice, have proved wholesome and helpful."

"The past is safe with Washington, Lincoln and Wilson. The challenge lies in the future—the immediate future. Our task is to search out the opportunity, state the cause and choose a leader. The leader must fit the cause."

"Nationalistic aspirations have been turned as promising possibilities from intolerable hatred, ship or as the only safe defense against aggression. European cynics and reactionaries have conjured, as they have for centuries conjured, with the fears and miseries of peoples and counsels that imperative armed readiness which all history teaches us not to be provocative of the very disaster which it pretends to avert."

"On the other hand, even in such a world, the first great respect in international cooperation has been making and succeeding. The league at Geneva has gathered to it the great lights of the old world. It has shined nothing to force, it has shined, shattering and dared to believe, as liberals always believe, in the power of good will. It has fought disease and vice, lifted Austria and Hungary back into the possibility of orderly national life, repatriated war prisoners, established a world court, prevented four wars and stopped one, set foot the only promising plan of disarmament yet devised, and never moved a single soldier."

"Between these two sets of forces the conflict is on. The battle rages now. Throughout the world the forces of militarism and imperialism are arrayed against the forces of liberalism. Within the next four years one or the other of these philosophies will prevail—which we are probably determining here today."

"The present administration has transferred our sympathy in this contest to the wrong side. Under the inspired guidance of Woodrow Wilson, America won the wealth of the world to snuff out understanding for mankind, standing to reform and prevent causes of hostility, and by engaging together in great constructive work for the common good, to build up an asset of good will, which in the hour of crisis, would enable the conscience of the world to collapse threatened conflict."

Irish Protestant Parishes Seek Vainly for Clergymen

DUBLIN, (AP)—The Protestant Bishop of Clonmore, Dr. MacManus, has struck a note of alarm in referring to the growing shortage of clergymen in the church of Ireland. He has five vacant parishes in his diocese and "not a single man in view for any of them." In his university days in Trinity College, he says, there were about 150 men preparing for the ministry. Now there are only from 20 to 30. "It requires," the bishop declared, "but a simple calculation to show that if this state of things continued for a comparatively short number of years the work of the church would come to a standstill."

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Improved Elevator Is Skyscraper's Impetus

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., (AP)—The possibility of skyscrapers towering 750 feet into the air is becoming more imminent with the perfection of vertical systems of transportation, which surmount the present type of elevator systems now employed in office buildings. Arthur Longwyke of New York, said in a report submitted today to the convention of the National Association of Building Engineers and Managers.

"Plans have been made for elevator cars controlled by a push button system to serve a building 750 stories in height, similar to an express elevator, but with an express service on a railway," said Mr. Longwyke. "Eight at the tenth, twenty at the thirtieth and every ten floors to the top are provided, with a local service for each ten floors. While the plan may not be put in operation in the immediate future, I mention it as an illustration of the possibilities in future buildings of great height."

The push button system will be installed in the new Standard Oil building in New York, he declared. Under the system, the passenger announces his floor as he steps in the elevator and the operator pushes a button for that floor. The car is not stopped until it reaches the floor for which the button has been pushed, unless prior to reaching that floor it serves at one where there is a waiting passenger who has pushed a floor button.

Prohibition in Saskatchewan To Be Decided by Plebiscite

REGINA, Sask., (AP)—The eyes of students of prohibition throughout the world are turned on Saskatchewan to see whether this province will follow Quebec, Alberta, Manitoba and British Columbia in turning to government sale as the best method of dealing with liquor. The question will be before the voters in a provincial plebiscite July 15.

The province of Saskatchewan has been dry since 1916. A plebiscite in 1920 continued the dry regime by a vote of 56,949 to 55,259. Last year a petition for sale of liquor under provincial control was denied by the Saskatchewan government. When the province
