ments of real strength. For the men proposed to be united under these battle cries are John W. Davis, of West Virginia and New York, a "safe and sane progressive," a lawyer and a diplomat, and Jonathan M. Davis, honest-to-goodness dirt farmer, at present governor of Kansas.

"Davis and Davis," say backers of this pair, could sweep the country. "John W. would account for everything east of the Alleghenys, Jonathan M. for everything in the middle west and west. The south, being Democratic, would take care of itself."

Psychologically, the heaviest handicap carried by Sam Halston of Indiana is his unavailability as a subject for snappy slogans. No one can figure out how to rouse enthusiasm with Halston. No one denies his ability, his sincerity, honesty or his political strength, but popular strength as well as personal and political strength will be needed to warm the voters sufficiently to offset the Coolidge coolness.

And right there is where the Carter Glass boomers find an opening for their candidate. "Let the light in with Glass," they suggest. "Glass will warm things up. Under Glass Coolidge coolness can be made to run. If it is too hot it will melt; if it is too cold it will be dissipated."

"Who'll be the candidate? Why it's a cinch! Glass! That clear?" One of the impressive things in the early stages of the convention, to those who followed the preliminary jockeying of the pre-convention period, is the apparent insignificance of the Underwood strength.

Outside the Underwood headquarters and the Alabama delegation little attention seems to be given the Alabama senator, either. It has flattened out or Oliver Newman and C. C. Carlin, his managers, have a surprise up their sleeve. They appear cheerful enough. Perhaps they will prove political magicians and still pull out the sizeable vote.

TEN MILLIONTH FORD TO CROSS UNITED STATES

With Ford No. 10,000,000 scheduled to cross the United States on the Lincoln Highway, a genius for figures has worked out the matter of staging a parade of the entire 10,000,000 Model T Fords, according to information received by W. C. Perkins, of the Perkins Motor company.

Here's the way he figures it. The road selected is 24,840 miles long circling the earth at the equator—he parks the Fords in one place at the side of the road, sets a pace of twenty miles an hour for the parade and starts the cars at intervals of thirty seconds.

Drivers are to have an eight-hour day, the same as that enjoyed by all Ford employees and are, of course, to have Sundays, Christmas, New Year's and Fourth of July off.

If you were inclined to watch such a parade and would remain until the last car passed, you'd have to stick at your place along the line for thirty-two and a half years.

With all the Fords remaining in line, it wouldn't be long before you would find yourself in the center of a whirling corker of cars.
