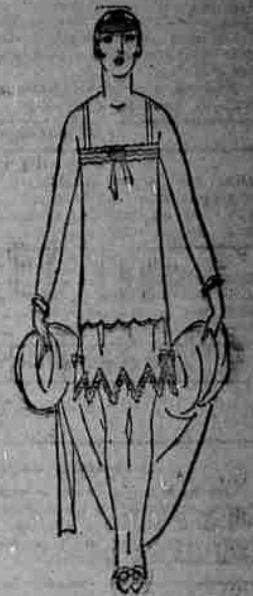

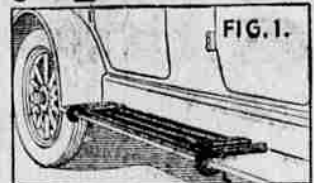

FIG. 1.—Showing Superior Luggage Carrier clamped on the running board, in folded position. Does not have to be removed from car when not in use.

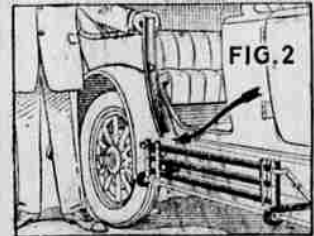

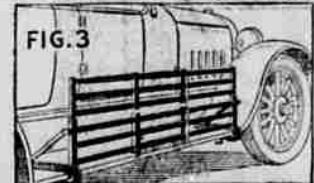

FIVE SLAIN IN WEIRD MURDER

Whole Family Is Wiped Out; Authorities Think Blood Lust Was the Motive.

CHICAGO. (By the Associated Press)—Beaten to death and their bodies carefully covered by sheets or blankets, the bodies of Otto Eder, taxicab chauffeur, his wife, Frances, and their three sons, Roy, 11, Harvey, 6, and Jack, 3, were found in their home late Sunday night.

There was no disorder in the house and no attempt at robbery was apparent. Police said they thought the family had been killed by a half-witted relative, or a boarder filled with a lust to slay.

"It looks to me like the work of a man stupidly filled with a lust to kill," said Henry A. Wolf, chief of police of Elmhurst, the suburb in which the Eders had lived.

The bodies of Eder and the two youngest boys were found in a bedroom, their heads smashed. Mrs. Eder lay in the dining room, and the body of the oldest boy had been tossed into a half-filled bath tub. The tub had been covered with a blanket.

Two neighbors who investigated at midnight, after they became alarmed by protracted silence, in the Eder home, said they had heard the relative of the Eders, who is sought by the police, call the eldest boy late Sunday afternoon.

Victim's Recovery Expected. ALBANY, Ore.—Physicians attending Spart Jordan of Dever, Ore., who was seriously injured when the automobile in which he was riding collided with a northbound Oregon Electric train, expressed belief that he would recover. Mr. Jordan sustained a wrenched neck, many bruises and possibly a fractured skull when he was hurled 60 feet from the train from the impact of the crash. The accident occurred when Jordan's car stalled on the track in the path of the moving train.

Army Riflemen Quality 100 Per Cent as Marksmen

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The Thirtieth infantry, stationed here, is establishing the reputation of being the best regiment of marksmen in the army; it is said at western division headquarters. Recently 45 men of the regiment went to the rifle range at Fort Barry with automatic rifles. The qualification of "expert rifleman," the highest grade awarded for marksmanship, was given to 44 and the other two won the rank of "sharpshooter," the next highest grade. The automatic rifle, a light, air-cooled machine gun, is carried and fired like an ordinary rifle and requires expert handling. Out of 99 automatic gunners of the regiment, 85 have qualified as expert riflemen this year and the other five rank as sharpshooters.

Rate Schedules Asked.

KLAMATH FALLS. — Freight rate schedules for 27 3-10 miles of Eugene-Klamath railroad, from Kirk north to Skookum, a railroad camp at the head of the falls on the new line, have been sent in for the approval of the public service commission, according to word received from the local railroad office. Passenger service to this new station is likewise to be inaugurated about July 1.

This will complete the line 79 miles north of Klamath Falls, and leave a gap of approximately 70 miles of mountain construction between Skookum and Oakridge, over which right-of-way clearing and grading is progressing rapidly.
