GAME FARM TO BE INSTALLED

PENDLETON, Ore. (AP).—Pendleton county is to have the third state game farm of Oregon, according to a decision reached by the state game commission in session here recently. In addition to the game farm, the commission authorized the construction of three more fish hatcheries, one to be located in eastern Oregon, one in the Willamette valley.

The site for the game farm for this county will be selected by the two members of the commission from the eastern part of the state in conjunction with local sportsmen. Harold Clifford of Fairlie City and Judge J. W. Maloney of Pendleton are the two members of the game commission from eastern Oregon.

The farm will be modeled along the lines of the one at Eugene and will have a yearly capacity of approximately 4500 pheasants. Tentative plans call for 85 or seven acres to be under seven. Both the game farm and the hatcheries will be constructed during 1924, according to Captain A. E. Burghdoff, state game warden.

As a result of the commission's visit to this county, Umatilla sportsmen are forming a county league that will cooperate with the game commission for the protection and conservation of wild life in Oregon. It is planned to have all the towns of the county

in the organization with equal voting power in order to limit and control sectional feeling. The plan has received strong endorsement from the commission.

Water in Lake Holding Well.

FOOD RIVER, Ore.—Game Warden Gilmore and Game Commissioner Wichter of Shasta county, Washington, just back from an inspection of Goose lake, reported that the water was holding well. Fishermen had brought in word earlier in the season that water in the lake was falling rapidly. Last year, following the great Japanese earthquake, the lake bottom was found to have developed serious leaks. It was caked with banks of earth and branches of trees. The lake bottom is composed of brittle lava rock.

Subsidies to Irish Farmers Not Approved by Commission

DUBLIN (AP).—The commission of inquiry into Irish agriculture, in its final report, finds a serious depression in farming. The farmer, the report declares, receives for his produce 40 per cent higher than before the war, but his cost of living has risen by 50 per cent and his trade expenses in some cases by over 100 per cent.

Education and organization are the two chief remedies suggested by the commission, and the state is urged to devote considerable sums to these purposes. The commission is opposed to subsidies or bounties, which in an agricultural country would, they say, mean transferring the money from one pocket of the farmer to the other. Reduction of railway freights and development of water transport are recommended.

Night Watchmen Object When Robbers Disturb Their Sleep

DANZIG (AP).—Night watchmen have complained that because of the progressive methods of thieves they cannot sleep properly at night.

Recently robbers endeavoring to gain entrance to a food store managed to get into the basement and began boring through the wooden floor for the purpose of cutting a panel that would admit their bodies. It happened that the night watchman was asleep on the floor at that particular spot and when his body was pricked by the sharp instrument he set up a cry that aroused all the night watchmen and policemen in the neighborhood.

The building was quickly surrounded and the robbers were captured.

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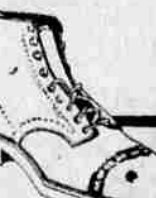
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
