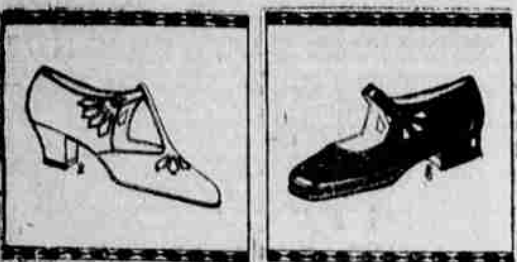

SPORT NEWS

LADDER GOLF PLAY IS NEXT

Country Club All-Season Tournament Can Begin July 15th; System Is Explained.

What promises to be one of the most interesting affairs in connection with the Country club tournaments begins on July 15 with the inauguration of a ladder tournament. A new handicap rack has been installed at the Country club locker room and in this rack all players are arranged according to their handicap, beginning at the top with the lowest and running down according to carefully computed ratings. The new system provides for the regular of all scores made on the course on the reverse side of the card and the five best scores are listed on the front side. From these figures the actual handicap is determined. On July 15 these will be arranged accordingly and the tournament can then begin.

To illustrate the operation of the tournament: The man at the bottom of the rack who naturally would have the highest handicap can challenge the man immediately above him as indicated by the rack. Within one week the man who has been challenged by the man below play. He has a right to say whether it shall be nine holes or eighteen holes. Assuming the man who did the challenging failed to beat the man above him he cannot re-challenge for a period of ten days. In this event there would be no re-arrangement of the cards in the rack. Assuming that player who challenged the man above him was successful, he moves his card up and the defeated man comes down one notch. The man who was beaten cannot challenge his victor for ten days. The tournament is continuous operating through the whole season and the man who has climbed highest or the man on the top who has withstood all comers will naturally be the winner of the tournament.

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ITALIAN HEAD FACES CRISIS

Cabinet to Meet with Premier Mussolini Today to Outline Policies to Appease People.

ROME (AP)—The first meeting of Premier Mussolini's reconverted cabinet will be held Wednesday morning when it is expected that plans will be discussed for picking fascism on firmer ground now and the reconvening of parliament next November.

The government's program for what is called "normalization" of the country will be set forth by the premier.

Mussolini will deal largely with the political situation brought about by the disappearance and alleged murder of Socialist Deputy Matteotti and also with foreign relations. Luigi Portogruaro, the new minister of the interior, will outline the prospects from purely an internal point of view.

The keynote of the cabinet meeting, according to the usually well informed Giornale d'Italia, will be a reassertion of the principle of fascism taking it for granted

that the country's confidence in the government has been materially shaken by recent events. Forthcoming policies will be shaped accordingly.

Militia, Delicate Question.

One of the most delicate points to be discussed is the question of disbanding the fascist national guard. This is one of the conditions under which the opposition will consider further participation in parliament. The government has hitherto considered the absorption of the militia into the regular army sufficient concession but it is thought to be probable the Mussolini government will allow the militia to be robbed of its purely fascist complexion. This would be the case if General Deboned of the militia were dismissed as the opposition is strongly demanded.

The tripartite D'Italia declares that in any event a satisfactory solution of the militia question will be considered the touchstone of fascist ability to reinstate itself in the eyes of the country.

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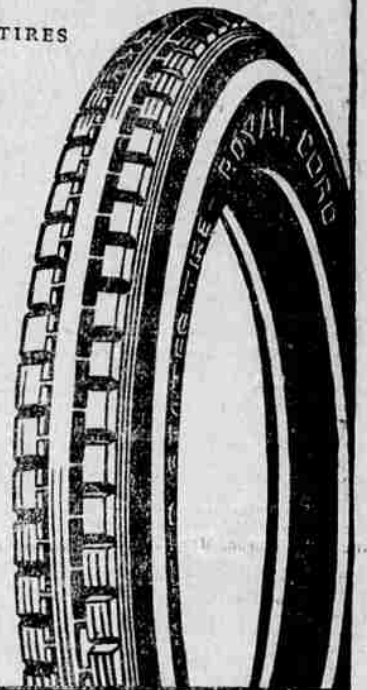
