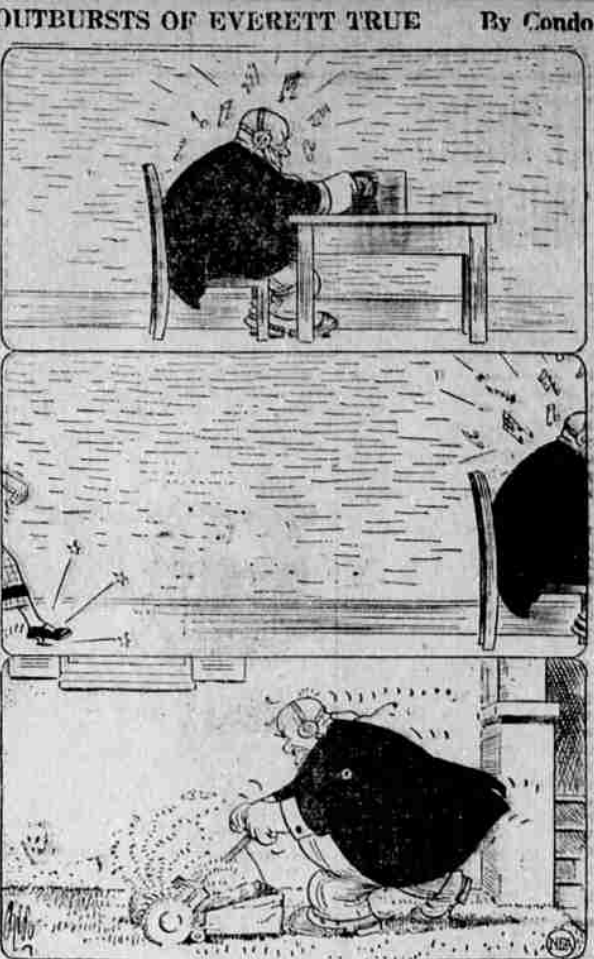

ISLE ROYALE NEW RESERVE

WASHINGTON, (AP)—A national playground 45 miles long and nine miles wide and embracing 132,000 acres of virgin wilderness, prolific flora, rare orchids and wild animal life is planned by the government on Isle Royale, in Lake Superior. The island, which is accessible to the entire middle west recently was visited by Stephen T. Mather, director of the National Park Service, who on his return to Washington reported the site an ideal one for recreation purposes. The natural displays on Isle Royale, Director Mather reported, make its permanent preservation of utmost importance, nearly a score of attractive harbors, a like number of lakes and many swift-flowing trout streams providing a fisherman's paradise.
Steps already have been taken to secure the island for the government, and Mr. Mather says the genuine public spirit and the sincere interest in its preservation shown by the principal owners and others has guaranteed the creation of a great playground for the American people.
Besides its great virgin forests, the island is said to be inhabited by a herd of 1500 tame moose, 400 woodland caribou. Thousands of wild fowl and migratory birds visit the land for breeding purposes.

LAST OF WHITMAN RESCUERS DEAD IN SPOKANE, WN.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP)—John A. Stoughton, 94, said to be the last living member of the group of men which rescued the Whitman massacre survivors, died recently at the Spokane county infirmary at Spangle.
Mr. Stoughton was one of the oldest pioneers in the northwest. He came west in the wagon train led by Marcus Whitman in 1847 and settled at Oregon City. From there he moved to Cheney, Wash., where he ran a farm for 27 years. Because of his part in the Whitman massacre the Spokane county Historical society in planning to build a monument to his memory somewhere in Spokane county, probably in the city of Spokane.
