AMERICANS WIN FIRST ROUND OF OLYMPIC TENNIS

PARIS, (AP)—Helen Wills, the American woman tennis champion, advanced to the second round of the women's singles in the Olympic tennis competition which began Sunday, through the default of Mme. Marnet of Spain.

In the men's singles Vincent Richards, United States, defeated Delavoye, Belgium, 6-2, 6-4, 6-0. Watson M. Washburn, United States, won from Serventi, Italy, 6-4, 6-2, 6-4, and Francis V. Hunter, won over Graham of Finland by a score of 6-2, 6-0, 6-2. One of Great Britain's Big Four, J. D. P. Whitley, was defeated by Fukuda of Japan, 6-2, 6-4, 6-4.

Then in the eighth Pendleton added four more and the play of it was all forgotten. McGarrigle went to first on an outfield error. Hoskins went to first on a fielder's error. Olsen singled scoring Hoskins and also came home when Peckham let one drift by. First went out to Clifford, Clark singled but was caught on second, Clifford to Holms when Hoskins gained the initial sack on a fielder's choice. King hit for two bases, scoring Hoskins. Cox grounded out.

Team blew up. In other words the entire team blew up as a whole. Three errors and three hits let in four runs and lost Pendleton's victory.

Pendleton's infield, with the exception of Peters, first baseman, played excellent ball. Clark nabbed a hard one in the fourth and started a double in the fifth, to Peters.

La Grande's infield looked good during eight innings and contributed one double play and several snappy assists and putouts.

Davis, King, Clark and Olsen were the best hitters, each getting two.

A good sized crowd witnessed the final official appearance of the Swabshucklers.
