Notice of Hearing on Proposed Street Improvement.

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that the Commission of the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, proposes and intends to improve Improvement District No. 145 in the City of La Grande, Oregon, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor heretofore adopted by the Commission, and that the report of the Commission on estimates for said improvement is now on file in the office of the Recorder of the City of La Grande, Oregon; that the said Commission has set Wednesday, the 23rd day of July, 1924, at 7:30 o'clock p. m. of said day, at the Commission Room in the City Building in La Grande, Oregon, as the time and place when and where said Commission will meet and hear and determine all objections, remonstrances and claims of grievance of any persons against said proposed improvement and the proposed assessment therefor against the property to be benefited thereby in said district.

That the boundaries of the district to be improved and benefited by the said proposed improvement as finally adopted by the Commission are as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the center of the intersection of "N" Avenue and Oak Street in the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon; thence north along the center line of Oak Street one hundred sixty (160) feet; thence east along a line one hundred sixty (160) feet from and parallel to the center line of "N" Avenue a distance of four hundred fifty (450) feet; thence north along a line one hundred fifty (150) feet from and parallel to the center line of First Street to the center of "O" Avenue; thence east along the center line of "O" Avenue three hundred ten (310) feet; thence south along a line one hundred sixty (160) feet from and parallel to the center line of First Street a distance of four hundred eighty (480) feet; thence west along a line one hundred sixty (160) feet from and parallel to the center line of "O" Avenue to the center of Oak Street to point of beginning; all located in Chaplin's and Wisdom's Additions to the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon.

Said improvement district No. 145 is hereby created by the Commission of the City of La Grande, for the purpose of improving and with the intention to improve said improvement district by grading the following named streets thirty (30) feet in width (except sidewalk excavation) to the proper subgrade; "N" Avenue from the east property line of Oak Street to the center line of First Street including two full street intersections; First Street from the south property line of "O" Avenue to the north property line of "N" Avenue including two alley intersections and by constructing therein hard surface pavement thirty (30) feet in width between curb lines; concrete curb and gutter where curbs are in place, concrete sidewalks where not in place, also by constructing the necessary inlets, catch basins, etc., all on the above named streets located in Chaplin's and Wisdom's Additions to the City of La Grande, Oregon. The foregoing improvements to be assessed to the property especially benefited thereby.

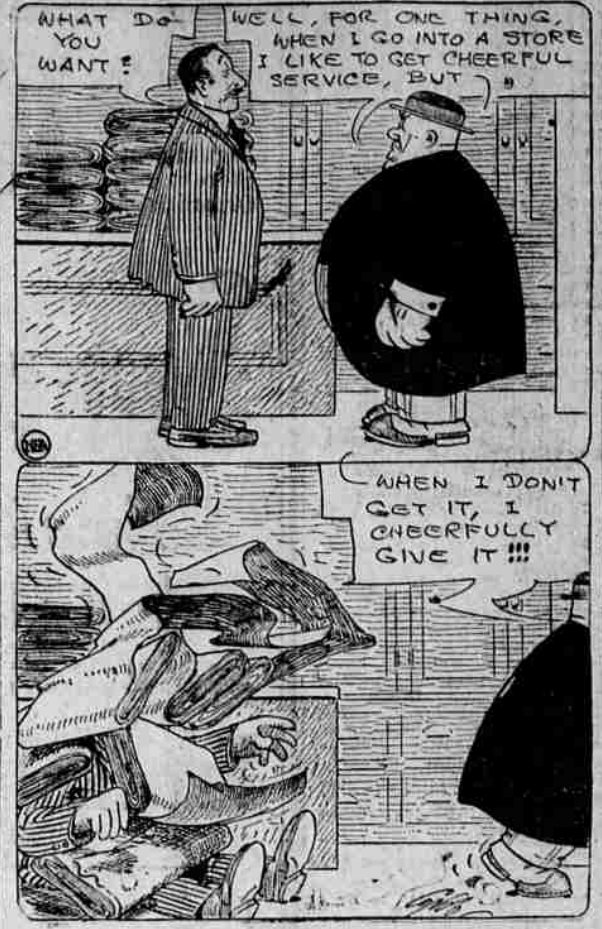

A picture that ends with such a dash of speed that it almost leaves one breathless opens at the Arcade theatre today.

It is "Pure Grit," a Universal Western feature dealing with life in the southwestern range country. A girl is shown in a husband's drawn over a rocky mountain road by a runaway horse. One of the big thrills occurs when the hero takes a couple of curves overhanging a cliff on two wheels with the girl clinging desperately to the back of the seat when she is rescued from the ditch.

In the terrific fight that results, the cabin breaks into flame. The men slug each other which gives the school teacher an opportunity to break through a window and escape.
