False Labels Lead Berlin

Stores Into Serious Trouble

BERLIN, CALIF. — On the theory that "all that glitters is not gold," a new city ordinance makes it a misdemeanor for merchants to mislabel goods displayed in their shop windows. If glass or some kind of stone is shown with a tag containing that it is a diamond, and it is discovered that the article in question is an imitation, then the merchant is subject to a fine and imprisonment.

The ordinance applies also to food, and when liverwurst is displayed in stores it must be labeled as such, and not meat from swine, which has been brought here in refrigerators.
