TY COBB IS A SUPER PLAYER

May Smash String Record of 200 Hits a Year; Holds More Marks Than Any Other.

DETROIT, (AP)—Ty Cobb, the Detroit manager, has accumulated more individual records than any player who has performed in the major leagues and is still at it. During 19 years in the American League Cobb carved his name as one of the immortals of baseball and when he surpassed Hans Wagner's record of having batted .300 or better for 12 consecutive seasons (Cobb's mark now is 13) He more was expected of the Georgia Peach.

The wear and tear of 19 campaigns in the major leagues is supposed to slow up a player beyond the point of record-breaking ability; in fact, the majority of players disappear from the big leagues long before that time. With all the laurels he has won and making new statistical records in every game this season, Cobb is on his way to another mark that has been on the books for several years—the consecutive years in which a player has made 200 or more hits in a season.

Willie Keeler, one of the most expert batmen of his day, turned the trick for eight consecutive seasons. Cobb tied that mark last year, and this season has a fair chance of running his string to nine. He was well above the century mark when the 1924 campaign reached the half-way post.

ASSOCIATION FOR WESTERN COLLEGE OARSMEN PLANNED

MADISON, (AP)—Rowing bids fair to become one of the major sports of western schools, in the opinion of T. E. Jones, athletic director at the University of Wisconsin, and other Wisconsin officials. The first step in placing the sport on a par with other athletic activities is consideration of plans for the formation of a Western Rowing Association.

Preliminary plans for its formation were discussed here by Director Jones and Darwin McInnes of Washington University. It is proposed to establish an annual regatta which in time may rank with the intercollegiate classic at Doughkeese. The regatta would be held alternately at various seats of the member schools.

A dozen universities, probably will be included in the list invited to join the association but the following are outstanding possibilities: Washington, winner of the Doughkeese regatta during the last two years; Wisconsin, California, Lehigh, Stanford, Chicago, Michigan and Minnesota.

Another proposal is the establishment of a separate building at Doughkeese, should the member schools decide to continue to compete in the eastern race. The Western association members also would cooperate in planning competition with eastern schools.

BABE RUTH FAR IN LEAD OF ALL 4-BASE HITTERS

CHICAGO, (AP)—Babe Ruth's drawing away from the rest of the heavy hitters in the American league and the spurs of Kelly, New York, and Hartnett, Chicago, in the National league feature the home run record of the major circuits in the last week. Ruth pounded out more four-ply blows than any other player, getting two on Monday, one Saturday and one Sunday, making his season's total 25.

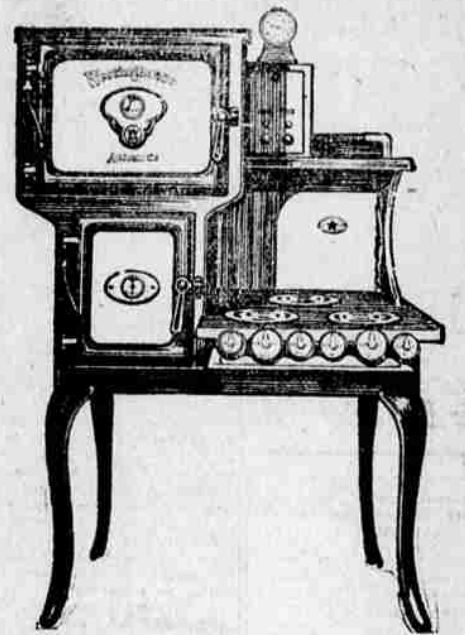
