Cullen, strangely enough, happens to be a real "dirt farmer." He has 800 acres of land near Downer's Grove, west of Chicago. Besides his grain, he is raising thoroughbred horses, cattle and hogs.

"The dirt farmer and cash grain merchant of Downer's Grove," as

financial writers call him, is by no means an upstart in the grain market. He has been on the Board of Trade since '95.

He was born in Ontario 54 years ago. As a boy, he hoed corn—work that has made him a millionaire several times over. He nearly always has lived in small towns.

Cullen came to Chicago 34 years ago, getting a job as bookkeeper in a grain office. He remained in his employ 14 years.

He is a quiet, unassuming man who becomes shy to the point of bashfulness when asked about his business dealings.

"I don't want people to know about me," he declares. "I have just made a deal and that is all there is to it. What I have done was done only on years of experience and trading."

"I have not gambled, for the corn has been sold for useful purposes."

Cullen is not a "frantic" trader. He is a steady, sure-footed man.

He sits in a front chair in his "public room," quietly giving his orders, even while the bidding is hottest.

He dodges publicity. He wants only to be left alone.

RETURNS FROM TRIP IN EAST

DeLile Greene, Delegate
to the Elks Convention,
Tells of Journey.

Of all the places he visited during his trip east, the one which impressed him most was the grave of the "unknown" soldier in Washington, D. C., declared DeLile Greene when with Mrs. Green returned to La Grande yesterday after having traveled in the neighborhood of 8000 miles since leaving.

The spot where the unknown soldier is interred seems to be particularly hallowed, said Mr. Greene referring again to the time he spent in Washington, "for no matter what the race, nationality or species every person whom I observed doffed his hat and stood bareheaded while near the spot where the unidentified soldier symbolizing the soldiers lost in the Great War, lies buried."

In Washington, Mr. and Mrs. Green visited many other places of an historical interest, among them the Capitol, the White House, the Lincoln Memorial, the Smithsonian Institute, the Federal building and others.

In the Federal building they saw government employees making survey of large denominations and stamps. Many postcards are taken at this building to guard against talking or communicating with the workers, according to Mr. Greene. He described the building telling how the visitors were taken through mezzanine floors several feet above the main floor of the building. The Lincoln Memorial and the Smithsonian Institute are both very wonderful, asserted Mr. Greene. "The Institute would take a person a year to go through it and see everything in it," he said. "It is on the order of a museum and has everything conceivable on exhibition."

On leaving La Grande Mr. and Mrs. Green traveled directly to Chicago, thence to Buffalo, New York, Boston, Washington, D. C., and on the return trip they visited for a few days at Atchison, Kansas and Denver, Colorado. Mr. Greene was sent as delegate to the national Elks' convention in Boston visiting the other cities en route.

There were 2532 official delegates to the convention and it was estimated that 90,000 Elks besides the regular residents of Boston were in the city at the time.

During the convention the order staged a huge parade which took three hours and a half to pass a given point. In the parade were 70 bands.

According to Mr. Greene's observations Niagara Falls is just as popular a resort as ever for honeymoon and vacation trips. Thousands of people were there at the time he viewed the falls.

The only unpleasant feature of the whole trip was the excessive heat encountered throughout the east, said Mr. Greene. Despite the heat he said that he and Mrs. Green enjoyed the trip exceedingly and his only wish was that he had taken two weeks longer to make it in.

DRY AGENT'S SON GUILTY

KIAMATH FALLS, Ore.—Walter Tankley, son of G. W. Tankley, state prohibition deputy at Kiamath Falls was convicted in circuit court here on a charge of possessing 20 gallons of moonshine.

For Tankley, wanted for questioning in connection with the case of his son, could not be located and is reported to have left for parts unknown.

The case was unusual in that both the attorney for the defense and the district attorney filed petitions for a change of venue from Judge Leavitt's court, alleging prejudice. Both motions were overruled.

PRESIDENT OF COLLEGE QUILTS

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special).—The resignation of Dr. William Clarence Weir, president of Pacific University at Forest Grove, will be presented to the board of trustees of that institution in the near future and he will retire to assume the presidency of Rollins college, at Winter Park, Florida, to which position he was elected last Saturday.

Under the rules governing the board of trustees of the Forest Grove institution that governing body can be called together in special session only by 10-day notices given to its members. Dr. Weir said that he would request that a meeting of the board be called before which he could present his resignation for acceptance.

Denies Report.

Dr. Weir insists that his retirement from the head of the Forest Grove university is not caused by, and has no connection with, any disagreement over the merger of the management or financing of the university jointly by the United Presbyterian and the Congregationalists. His acceptance of the new position offered him, and the problem of financing the institution "are two stories entirely," Dr. Weir says.

S. P. AND W. P. RAILROADS AGREE ON TRAFFIC SYSTEM

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Operating officials of the Western Pacific and Southern Pacific railroads are ready to put into effect August 1 the agreement by which the tracks of the two companies from a point each of Winnemucca, Nev., to a point west of Wells, Nev., will be used as one double track system. For the last few months thousands of men have been employed by the railroads to improve the roadbeds and prepare connections for the new system of traffic.

Between the points indicated, all westbound traffic will go over the Western Pacific and all westbound trains over the Southern Pacific.

William Bender Arrested

ST. HELENS, Ore.—Charged with a statutory crime against his minor daughter, William Bender, 50, is in jail here, having been found over to the grand jury by Justice of the Peace Shorin who fixed bail at \$4000. The man recently moved to the Delma section from Longview and settled on a small ranch, Sheriff Wellington, who made the arrest, states that the man has a penitentiary record in Washington and has confessed that he is guilty of the crime of which he is accused. He has a wife and five children.

SCOTT TRAIL REOPENED

EUGENE, Ore.—The historic Scott trail over which hundreds of early pioneers of Lane county and other counties of western Oregon crossed the summit of the Cascade mountains on the last leg of their westward journey across the plains, is now being reopened by a force of forest trail builders.

The original trail crossed the summit of the mountains about 10 miles south of the present Klamath pass. While it was scarcely made wide enough for the wagons of the pioneers to traverse the rocky slopes of the mountains, under the construction process it will be wide enough only for horses to pass over it.
