ROCKNE GETS NEW CONTRACT

CHICAGO, (AP)—When Knute Rockne entered the University of Notre Dame 15 years ago as a poor working student, doing all kinds of odd jobs to pay for his tuition and board, he little dreamed that he would step into a position that was to pay him \$100,000 a year as coach of that famous eleven. Rockne is to do just that when the new contract becomes effective in 1925.

Rockne, by signing a contract to remain at Notre Dame for the next ten years at an annual salary reported to be \$10,000 a year, becomes one of the highest paid teachers of football in America. Of the terms of his salary, Rockne himself has nothing to say, but these close to him declare he was offered \$10,000 a year last fall to become head football coach at the University of Iowa, succeeded by Howard Jones, and that Notre Dame would not part with him.

From a "handy" boy, determined to obtain an education, Rockne's career is a vivid story of a plucky fight against odds. The man who today is acknowledged as one of the foremost coaches in the country did not even know the principles of football when he entered Notre Dame in 1909. But under the direction of Jesse Harper, the Notre Dame coach, he began to learn quickly. He did what he was told. He practiced and trained hard and within three years was captain of the team that was hailed throughout the country as one of the greatest exponents of the forward pass ever developed.

When Rockne enrolled at Notre Dame he was without funds and no work was too menial for him to earn a few dollars. Gradually he became so proficient in chemistry that during his last year in school he acted as an assistant professor. It was in this same year that his name became famous in football, when Notre Dame met the Army for the first time and triumphed, 33 to 13. It was Rockne, on the receiving end of forward passes hurled by Gus Dorais, that swept the cadets off their feet.

After graduation, Coach Harper asked to retain Rockne as a football assistant. The dean of the chemistry department made a similar request. Rockne was wanted in two places. The officials arranged his work so he could work both jobs. A year later Harper retired to his western ranch and Rockne stepped into his shoes, holding the position as director of athletics, head football coach and track coach ever since.

Notre Dame's rise to athletic power under Rockne's direction has been swift. The football eleven always are contenders for national honors. Rockne, a national figure in American athletics, is of the "new school" in football. His system has brought about many innovations, such as the shift plays. These are designed to conceal the point of attack and to add force to the thrust. Weight is invariably sacrificed for speed and close up interference has made Notre Dame teams famous.

Rockne refers to Notre Dame as "my school" and declares he never will leave, as long as they wish to retain him.

End of Napoleonic Dynasty
Recalled by Death of Sydney MARIPOSA, Calif. (AP)—The recent death of Captain O. H. Sydney at his home here recalls an event significant in French history.

Captain Sydney was in Africa in 1873 on business for the British government. One day he found the body of a man who turned out to have been the prince imperial of France, the only son of the ex-emperor Napoleon III. It was presumed generally at the time that the prince was slain by Zulus, with whom Great Britain then was at war. But Captain Sydney noticed that the heart did not lie out of the body, a tribal fetish of the Zulus in dealing with their enemies, and he always contended that no Zulu fired the shot that closed the career of the last of the Napoleons. It was his theory that the prince was the victim of a political intrigue.

The prince imperial was a great nephew of Napoleon Bonaparte. He was serving as a volunteer in the British army at the time of his death. His mother, the ex-empress Eugenie, lived until 1920.

Oroville Bank Suspends
OROVILLE, Wash.—Owing to the National Surety company having canceled the \$10,000 bond of the First National bank here, given to secure deposits of public funds, the bank closed its doors. The bank was capitalized for \$50,000 and had deposits of approximately \$250,000. The officers are R. P. Cover, president; S. H. Starnes, Jr., vice president, and Fred Hoyt, cashier.

"The bank was solvent and I do not believe that any one will suffer a loss," said Cashier Hoyt. "National Bank Examiner R. L. Edman is in charge and is not prepared to make a statement now. Plans are afoot among business men of the community, who are among the petulant shareholders, to reorganize the institution, and I believe that it will be reorganized in a short time."

J. McCrees Taken by Death.

WALLA WALLA, Wash.—John McCrees, age 71, died after a long illness at his home here. He served through the Civil war, being with Hooker at the battle of Lookout Mountain and with Sheridan on his march to the south. He was the first warden of the penitentiary. He leaves his widow and four children.

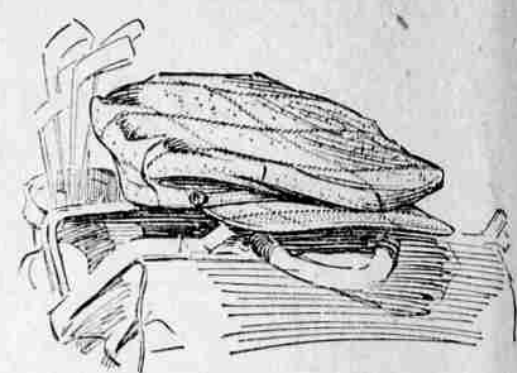
