**Mousquetaire Hat.**  
Paris—Among the semi-pleasure hats shown here today is the mousquetaire. It is a wide brimmed hat with a trim turning up a bit across the front. And, as with the warm weather, it is often trimmed with a rosette of fur.

**Consistent Platted Frock.**  
Paris—One species of platted frock is at least consistent today. In sand georgette, it is made up wholly of horizontal bands of plating, held together by wider bands of beige lace. Even the sleeves are platted. There is of course no belt.

**Flowers With Red Hat.**  
London—When you wear a bright red hat nowadays, which is surprisingly often, you also wear a little bunch of artificial flowers to match. These flowers are pinned upon the shoulder.

## COLLEGE GETS HEBREW BOOKS OF HIGH VALUE

CINCINNATI (AP).—A rare collection of old European Jewish books has been bought for the library of the Hebrew Union college of Cincinnati. Eight hundred book-plates heraldic, allegorical and emblematic, some dating as far back as 1730, collected during a long period of travel and search over Europe by Israel Solomons, collector of Angelica Judaica, were among the collection.

They were purchased by A. S. Oke, librarian of the college. In 1800, Jewish scholar of the eighteenth century, owned one of the plates, which is dated 1748. The collection also includes the book-plates of the late Chief Rabbi Herman Adler, Elkan Nathan Adler, Jacob Franco, Moses Isaac Levy, Emanuel Mendes, Da Costa, the Diazis and the Rothschilds, the Montifiores, and other scholars and philanthropists.

As was customary in the early days of the eighteenth century, many of the book plates bear a coat of arms or other data of significance to the student of heraldry and genealogy, and clearly indicates the interests of the original owners. The plate of Elkan Nathan Adler bears the picture of a traveler reading a scroll, and shows two hands extended in religious blessing.

## CANADIAN GOVERNMENT ERECTING FARTHEST NORTH WIRELESS STATION

OTTAWA (AP).—Erection of the farthest north wireless station in the world, to be on Herschel Island, has been got under way this summer by the Canadian government.

The island, which is only 26 miles long and 5 miles wide, stands 500 feet high in the Arctic Ocean at the mouth of the Mackenzie river, five miles east of the international boundary line.

Messages from Herschel Island are to be received in Dawson, Y. T., or Mayo, 150 miles east of Dawson, whence they are to be transmitted to Fort Smith or Fort Simpson, which are in the southern part of the Northwest Territories. Thence the messages would be relayed to Edmonton, which is connected by chains of Canadian government wireless stations with Vancouver, B. C., and Halifax.

**MAY HAVE SELLING STATION ANACONDA, Mont.**—Provided plans materialize, a distributing house for Bitter Root valley produce will be established in Anaconda and a second one in Butte. Bitter Root valley men interested in the project were in the city recently inspecting prospective sites and conferring with local merchants, several of whom are said to have approved the idea.

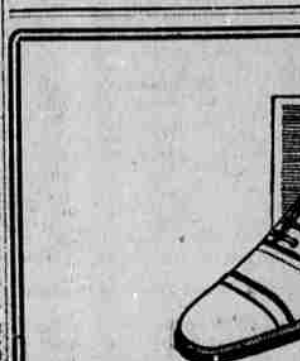
