Hints for the Housewife

DATE RECIPES
There is no reason why the kitchen should become a furnace during the hot weather if some care is taken to choose dishes which can be prepared without cooking. There are many cold dishes which are extremely palatable in this season.

People do not need much hot food in warm weather and, indeed, the members of your family will feel better if they eat sparingly of those foods which heat up the body. For this reason dates are an excellent summer food. They supply energy and nutriment without creating heat.

The Arabs in Mesopotamia live for weeks at a time on dates and milk and find it an excellent warm weather diet.

Below are some good recipes for date dishes which can be prepared without any cooking:

Date Salad Sandwiches
1 cup chopped dates, 1 cup chopped walnut meats, 1 cup chopped celery, mayonnaise.
Mix the dates, walnut meats and celery and moisten well with mayonnaise. Spread on buttered slices of bread and place a crisp lettuce leaf in each sandwich.

Date and Pear Salad.
1 cup dates, stoned and sliced, 1 cup fresh-keeping coconut, 2 large apples, chopped, 2 cups canned pears, chopped, cream mayonnaise dressing, crisp lettuce leaves.
Line salad plates with lettuce leaves. Mix dates with fresh-keeping coconut, add pears and apples, fill into the plates, top with dressing and a sprinkling of fresh-keeping coconut.

Fruit Salad.
2 apples, 2 oranges, 1 small

can pineapple, 2 bananas, 1 scant cup of dates.
Cut all to small pieces, heap on lettuce leaves and add mayonnaise dressing just before serving.

Date Whip.
1 pound dates, 1 pint whipping cream, 1 cup powdered sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 cup walnut meats.
Stone dates and cut into small pieces and also chop nuts. Whip cream until stiff, add nuts, sugar and dates. Add vanilla, chill and serve.

Date Dreams.
Pass equal quantities of dates and pecan meats through a food chopper. To 1 cup of the mixture add 1 cup maple sugar and a very little cream. Mix to a smooth paste and spread between thin slices of whole wheat bread.

Pineapple and Date Cream Sherbet.
4 tablespoons date pulp, 2 tablespoons orange juice, 1 teaspoon lime juice, 4 tablespoons pineapple syrup, 4 tablespoons cream, 1 teaspoon salt.
Stone and chop dates, rub them over with orange juice, lime juice, salt and pineapple syrup, partly freeze. Then add cream and complete the freezing.

Wheat Growers in Canada in Market Cooperatively
WINNEPEG, Man., (AP)—A wheat pool merger which contemplates the marketing of the entire wheat crop of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta by one cooperative organization, is being planned. The greater part of the wheat crop of these provinces has, in the past, been marketed by separate provincial pools.

Whether the merger will be effected in time to market this year's crop is uncertain, but those behind the movement declare they will begin wholesale cooperative marketing operations at least by next year.

"Canada has been a pioneer in advancing the interests of its farmers by the adoption of a co-operative marketing system," an official statement declared. "The cooperative movement in the nation is more than 20 years old. Practically every product of Canadian farms is now marketed co-operatively. The system has enabled the farmers to get the highest prices at a minimum cost of marketing."

regard of automobile laws, 47,825 arrests were made, \$876 being for speeding and 23,223 for traffic violations.

Major Dan Sullivan, superintendent of police, who, in connection with prohibition, describes Washington as "a hip-pocket town," explains the statistics by saying that Washington isn't growing more lawless but that the police are more vigilant.

So much for Washington's failure to live up to the laws she has. Now for a law she'd like to have, but hasn't.

Much more than additional prohibitive laws, saying what must not be done, Washington would like a "permissive" law, granting authority for the development of the water power now running to waste in the Potomac river at Great Falls, 15 miles above the capital.

Such a law, which is recommended by Secretary of Commerce Hoover, would make available 180,000 horsepower of energy, save hundreds of thousands of tons of coal annually, relieve congestion in freight transportation, and otherwise make Washington a better capital to live in.

Washington would just this law with joy and doubtless would give bond that it wouldn't result in a single additional arrest unless a

power company capitalists should have to be restrained from committing violence.

Grain Burns Near Pomeroy

POMEROY, Wash.—Fire of undetermined origin destroyed 70 acres of wheat on the S. E. Hester place, farmed by Oscar Burns. Men in automobiles poured in from surrounding farms and many from Pomeroy.

Within a few minutes more than 100 fire fighters were on the grounds. Furrows were plowed out the flames, saving the rest of the 250-acre field. A few acres had been harvested and it is said the yield was about 25 bushels an acre. The crop was insured.

Testing County Herds

TOLEDO, Ore.—Lincoln county is rapidly becoming free from bovine tuberculosis and this point was clearly emphasized as a result of the recent test of the north end of the county comprising the communities of Otis, Ross, Lodge, and Taft. In these communities 54 herds, containing 555 animals, were tested by a doctor of the U. S. bureau of animal industry, and but one reactor was found. In the other extremity of the county, seven herds were tested composed of 37 head and three reactors were found.

The bureau of animal industry and the county agent's office are cooperating in working out plans for the complete testing of the county under the area plan now followed in so many of the counties of the west.

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
