James Cruze again! What more need be said when one recalls such pictures as "The Covered Wagon," "Hollywood," "Hugles of Red Gap" and "To the Lungs."

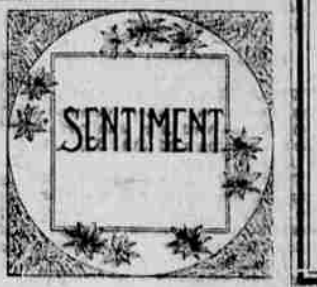

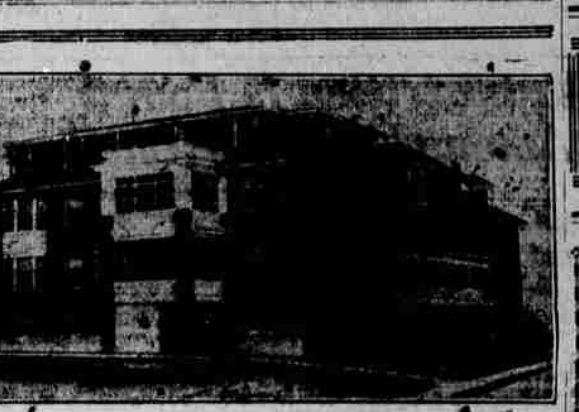
