Ordinance to Be Tested.

THE DALLIES, Ore.—A dispute between The Dalties and Hares A. Gordon, over the right of the latter to operate an auto park within the city limits came to a climax with the arrest of Gordon on a charge of operating the park without a license, and with the filing of an injunction suit by Gordon to prevent enforcement of the park licensing ordinance.

Hearings of the charges against Gordon are expected to await the outcome of a meeting of the city council when a delegation of citizens will ask repeal of the auto park ordinance.

Florida Proposal Seeks to Bar Inheritance and Income Taxes.

TALLAHASSEE Fla. (AP)—A proposal to amend the state constitution so as to provide that no inheritance tax or income tax shall ever be levied by Florida will be voted upon by the people of that state in the general election next fall.

The proposal was submitted to the voters in a resolution adopted by the last session of the legislature, in 1923. Under provisions of the proposed amendment heads of families would, should it be adopted, be exempt from taxation on household goods and personal effects to the value of \$200.
